At this point in the school year, our 8th grade scholars should start seriously thinking about which high school program/s they would like to apply for. **Each of the high schools will be holding a <u>virtual</u> discovery night on the dates listed below**. They will all begin at 6:00 p.m. Feel free to attend as many as you would like. Scholars will be allowed to apply for up to 5 different programs during the application period.

Each year the district puts out a comprehensive catalog further detailing each program and the application process. Once that catalog comes out, I will be going into all of the 8th grade social studies classes to discuss the specifics.

School Operations (Dr. Gordon, Assistant Principal of Operations)

- Our school safety and sanitizing procedures are in full swing. We are practicing social distancing in all areas of the school this
 includes one directional hallways and stairways. Each hall has hand sanitizer, and all classrooms are equipped with a
 sanitizing station. We have also implemented staggered class transitions and dismissal to minimize the number of students
 moving at one time. At the end of each school day, all classrooms are disinfected and sanitized.
- Please remind your scholar to wear their mask so that it covers their mouth and nose. Also remind them to stay six feet apart from their classmates as they move through the hallways.
- Please remind all scholars that have been issued a laptop to store it in their book bag when not in use. This will reduce the chance of damage and costly repairs that take time and leave the scholar without a device.
- We have received the remainder of the digital devices for students. By now most scholars should have a device. if you still do not have a device and would like one, please contact the school.

<u>School Expectations (Mr. Wicks, Assistant Principal of Athletics, Activities and Behavior Management)</u>

- Picture Day for face-to-face scholars was rescheduled to Nov 20 from Nov 11 due to the tropical storm. We will have two make up days in January for scholars who have not taken pictures: PCS scholars will take pictures the morning of Jan 19 (non-student attendance day) and Face-to-Face scholars will take pictures the morning of Jan 20.
- Athletics for the middle schools will not be until semester 2 with three truncated seasons (volleyball; basketball, cheerleading; track). Please begin preparing ahead of time. In order to try out, all athletes will need an athletic physical within the last year on file with the school. Athletic eligibility is having a minimum GPA of 2.0 from the previous semester. Since our sports will not be until semester 2, this means that the GPA requirement is based on their semester 1 grades (not quarters). If grades are in question, it is time to begin working to make gains. Take advantage of the ELP tutoring program before school for PCS scholars and after school for Face to Face scholars. Athletic participation packets are in the cafeteria and are on the website under quick links. All completed packets should be returned to Jerry Wicks in the 7th grade office. Scholars interested in boys volleyball should email Mr. Woods (woodsmik@pcsb.org) and scholars interested in girls volleyball should email Ms. Guyotte (guyottek@pcsb.org). Volleyball tryouts begin when we return from winter break.
- Bells will be utilized when we return from Thanksgiving break to note when scholars should be in class. We will still release classes by areas manually. As scholars walk immediately to their next class, there will be two bells: a 1-minute warning bell and then the bell which notes whether scholars were on time or not. Tardies will be marked and consequences assigned for scholars who are not meeting expectations of being on time. There is plenty of time to make it to class on time, even with the longest distances, if students don't stop for excessive socializing or horseplay.
- Parents/Guardians, we are looking for assistance. We are seeing an increasing number or students arrive on campus well before 9:00. Doors do not open into the building until 9:20 and we don't want scholars on campus before 9:15 as we want to ensure that they are properly supervised. Unfortunately, we see students on campus before 8AM! Please keep scholars at home longer in the morning to assist us.
- With students having laptops, cell phones are not needed in the classroom. As a reminder, phones should be turned off and out of site. Parents/guardians, please help us by not texting scholars during the day. Also, if you want to truly see how much your scholar may be using her or her phone or how distracted he or she may be during the day, take a look at his/her phone in the evening and go through the various texts, Snaps, social media posts, etc. One of the best ways to know what is going on in the life of your student is monitoring their electronics!
