Things to Do in Quarantine to Avoid Boredom

Sunshine, palm trees, a cool breeze on a warm spring day. These are things that coronavirus could not take away from young people and which helped kids keep busy outdoors during quarantine.

Many kids and families alike found themselves using their backyards as play spaces. Trampolines and pools offered immediate relief from the stuffiness of being inside in front of computer screens. They could jump, splash and be noisy in the privacy of their own spaces. Some people took their craving for fresh air to their neighborhoods, to the Pinellas Trail or Dunedin Causeway, which kept access along the trail and causeway open to walkers, runners, people on bikes, scooters, rollerbladers and skateboarders. Families got creative with their physical challenges too. Some families took part in virtual 24 hour marathons, where they'd run one mile per hour every hour and rest the remainder of the time. Tiring? Sure, but fun, healthy and rewarding too - to set a goal and accomplish it. Getting fit with family made memories for many doing unique activities together.

Some kids and families got crafty indoors and out. They tiedyed, painted on paper, canvas or alternate surfaces such as doors. Some brought the sidewalk chalk out and drew colorful and cheerful messages along sidewalks, driveways and in public spaces like the Pinellas Trail or in front of hospitals where others, like doctors and nurses, could appreciate it. Many families spent hours and hours piecing puzzles together. 200, 500, 1000-piece puzzles. Some chose to keep their creations intact once completed to hang like a picture and reminder of the time spent together in quarantine. Board games like Trouble, Sorry and physical classic games like Twister helped stave off boredom. Some took to cards like poker and rummy. Others began cooking and baking like never before.

Electronics of course offered students an easy fall back activity. Bingeing on series television was common, as kids and families relaxed at the end of a day. Video games played individually or on teams with friends helped pass the time, as well as learning and creating music videos for TlkTok. It is common for teens to know dozens of TikTok dances at any one time and you can spot a Tik Toker practicing easily by telltale signature moves. Kids posted new videos often as an outlet and a chance to connect with friends they had not seen in person in weeks.

As rules start to relax and folks begin to resume a semblance of pre-quarantine life, some may wonder how many of the physical and creative outlets will continue and how many new traditions may have been born out of a time that was sometimes dim and depressing. Spring and summer are a chance at starting new, being free from the responsibilities of school, to take vacation and hopefully enjoy less restrictive time off with friends and families.

True enough, once the beaches re-opened in May, students and families were easily spotted in small groups at a "social distance", playing in the sand, sun and water, not so differently from the days before coronavirus changed their lives.

Many students will never forget this time, especially the 8th graders, and all of the special things their class missed out on, but they will also take away the knowledge that even when freedom and their ability to connect in person with others is limited, kids are resilient and they can rise above, even better and more well-rounded people than ever before.

Now if you want to just have fun making a decorated canvas while stuck at home, try this. For this one all you need is crayons, a blow dryer, and a blank canvas.




