NORTH SHORE ELEMENTARY ATTENDANCE POLICY 2025/2026

When a child misses two school days a month, he or she will miss 20 days a year. This calculates to 30 hours of math over the school year, 60 hours of reading and writing, and one whole year of missed school by graduation.

Attendance Policy

- 1. After 2 absences in a row, your student's teacher will make contact.
- 2. Missing 10% or more school days, will result in call from the Child Study Team (Attendance Team).
- 3. If absences continue, an attendance letter will be sent home and documented.
- 4. If absences continue, an Attendance Matters Letter will be sent home.
- 5. If absences continue, parents will be invited to a Child Study Team Meeting.
- 6. If absences continue with no contact from the parent, a home visit may be completed.
- 7. If absences continue, a 3-Day Certified Letter will be sent home.
- 8. If absences continue, a Truancy Intervention Program referral will be made to the State Attorney.


Our school encompasses Central Ave to 54th Ave N, 16th St N to the coast and 4th St N to the coast.
