- Teachers, administrators, support staff, students, parents and the community share responsibility for achieving the school's mission.



# THINGS TO REMEMBER FOR REGISTRATION

- FRESHMEN academic options
- 1. Be sure to come at the appointed time for your registration. See attached appointment times. We will be working with groups of 25-30. Questions Call front desk and ask for Robin.
- 2. Be ready to select electives by your registration appointment. Bring a list of 4 electives ranked by preference. (If you have any questions about electives, please email Ms. Sturgill at sturgill@pcsb.org)
- 3. The middle schools have been instructed to mail Mrs. Sturgill a copy of the core recommendations. Know your student's standardized tests scores and current grades in case the middle school does not include these. You can get these on Focus under testing (7th grade scores) and gradebook grades.
- 4. There will be summer reading assignments for all English classes, both regular and honors, and for any AP class. They will be posted on our website the day before summer vacation begins: http://www.pcsb.org/osceola-hs.

No excuses for non-compliance are acceptable.

- 5. We will be having an orientation in August before school starts. Please check website for further details. **Dates have not yet been approved.**
- 6. Private School Students need to bring:

  - b. A recent report card and standardized test scores
  - c. Copy of Social Security card
  - d. Copy of birth certificate
  - e. 2 proofs of residency (Utility Bills)




