Safety and Security

The Pinellas Technical College-St. Petersburg (PTC-SP) administrative, instructional, and support staff is diligent in assuring a safe, orderly, and positive physical learning environment for the protection of the health and safety of students, staff, and guests. The District Safety & Security Council (DSSC) was created to coordinate district efforts to ensure a safe environment to learn and work. The DSSC is chaired by the PCS Administrator of School Safety and consists of representatives from the Superintendent's and Area Superintendent's offices, Human Resources, the School Board, Emergency Management, Schools Police, School Health Services, and Technology Information Systems.

Security Officers

As of the spring of 2018, the Pinellas County School Board acted to allow only sworn law enforcement officers and highly trained school safety officers (SSOs, also known as guardians) to be armed on campus. A School Resource Officer or an armed School Safety Officer is in place at PTC-SP. For more information contact Pinellas County Schools Police at 727-547-7221.

Emergency Management

PTC-SP conducts regular drills for various scenarios (fire, bomb threat, severe weather, lockdowns/closed campus, limited lockdowns, directional evacuations, etc.) in order for staff, students, and visitors to be prepared during critical incidents. Each classroom has an emergency evacuation map posted that instructors discuss with their classes. The school has monthly fire and active assailant drills during the school year. Tornado drills are held once a semester. Drills are conducted so that students and personnel can react quickly and appropriately to an actual incident. All occupants of the school must participate. During the drills, administrative and selected staff members check every building according to a detailed schedule that is reviewed and revised annually or more frequently if needed. Reporting Procedures

Pinellas County Schools has partnered with Sandy Hook Promise to offer the Say Something Anonymous Reporting System. Say Something allows you to submit secure & anonymous safety concerns to help identify and intervene upon at-risk individuals BEFORE they hurt themselves or others. Tips made to the Say Something Anonymous Reporting System are passed along to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials. **Visit the Say Something Anonymous Reporting System**

Additionally, the district utilizes FortifyFL, a school-related suspicious activity reporting tool that allows Florida students and the community the ability to instantly relay information anonymously concerning unsafe, potentially harmful, dangerous, violent or criminal activities, or the threat of these activities, to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials. FortifyFL was created and funded by the 2018 Florida Legislature as part of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act. **Visit the FortifyFL website**

Florida Statute 943.082 states that if, following an investigation, it is determined that a person knowingly submitted a false tip through FortifyFL, the Internet protocol (IP) address of the device on which the tip was submitted will be provided to law enforcement agencies for further investigation, and the reporting party may be subject to criminal penalties under s. 837.05. In all other circumstances, unless the reporting party has chosen to disclose his or her identity, the report will remain anonymous.

Clery/Crime Reports

The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act is the landmark federal law, originally known as the Campus Security Act that requires colleges and universities across the United States to disclose information about crime on and around their campuses. The definition used for purposes of these reports are particular to the act and may not be entirely consistent with those definition used by other entities that collect crime information.
