DIESEL MAINTENANCE TECHNICIAN



The Diesel Maintenance Technician program consists of three OCPs (subjects of study) that include Diesel Engine Mechanic/Technician Helper, Diesel Air Brakes Technician, and Diesel Preventative Maintenance Technician. This program will prepare students to enter the Diesel industry as proficient mechanics helpers, and service technicians, qualified to conduct routine inspections and repairs in various operations of Medium and Heavy-Duty trucks.

- Students will earn Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) Certifications in Brakes (T4) and Preventative Maintenance (T8)
- Bus and Truck Mechanics and Diesel Engine Specialists earn an average of \$23.24 per hour*
- Diesel Maintenance Technicians earn an average of \$14.84 per hour*
