What's a micro-credential?

Micro-credentials are smaller, shorter programs of study (3 or 4 designated courses) that are narrowly focused so that you can get specific skills in your chosen field. You'll earn a digital badge and **official credit** — it even goes on your **transcript**.

How micro-credentials work.

- ➔ Three or four designated stand-alone courses can lead to a micro-credential.
- ➔ Two micro-credentials, or a micro-credential and additional courses can amount to a Certificate.
- ➔ A Certificate and additional courses can advance to a Master's Degree.
