Isolation of senior citizens in Assisted Living Facilities.
4. Do you have an age/grade requirement for volunteers? **Yes**
- a. If yes, please specify: **High school freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors**
5. What are some typical activities that students might perform if they complete community service hours with your organization? **Students attend meeting of the school's Grandkids Club; they take approximately 2 hours of online training designed to prepare them for visits to ALFs; they make 7 visits to selected senior citizens in ALFs, with each visit structured around an activity designed to foster communication, empathy and learning for both the senior and the student; and they develop a Memory Book, which is a compilation of pictures, letters and materials that commemorate the life of the senior "Grandparent" and the time they student and the senior spent together.**
6. When can students volunteer at your organization?
- a. Days of the week? **Any day. Volunteer schedule depends on the students' availability and the times permitted by the ALFs.**
 - b. Typical number of hours per week available/required? **2**
 - c. Times they may volunteer? **Students can volunteer as often as they like. A typical volunteer session consists of Grandkids club meetings, online training sessions (8 modules) and seven visits to ALFs, each lasting approximately 2 hours.**
 - d. Do you have students volunteer during the summer months? **No**

Please briefly list any additional information that students may need to know about your organization if they are considering you as a community service agency: **The Our AIM Foundation was founded by Ishan Mandani, a Palm Harbor University High School student, and his mother, Nisha Manadani and exists to bridge the generation gap that often exists between teens and senior citizens. Particular focus is on creating opportunities for communication and learning between teens and older people in Assisted Living Facilities, especially those who may be isolated and may not receive many visitors. The Grandkids program operates through Grandkids Clubs at Florida high schools, currently in**

Pinellas, Hillsborough and Orange counties. Club activities are supervised by “sponsor teachers” at each school.
