Executive Summary of Lakeview Fundamental Elementary School Improvement Plan

Lakeview Fundamental Elementary School has 348 students grades K to 5th, 1 administrator, 26 teachers/instructional staff, and 12 support staff members which includes office staff, café staff, Extended Learning Model teacher, P.E. Assistant and Plant Operations. The mission of **Lakeview Fundamental** is to create an environment that foster at least one year of learning gains using a fundamental and holistic approach for every child

To accomplish this mission, Lakeview Fundamental Elementary has 6 goals:

1. The reading goal of Lakeview Fundamental Elementary is for students to achieve at least one year's worth of growth, Emphasis placed on the lowest 25% along with students in the subgroups of Black and Economically Disadvantaged along with students with SAT 10 scores below 4 in total reading and students in the lowest quintile as reported by the district. Exceed the district and state proficiency rate by a minimum of 10% points as measured by FSA.
2. The writing goal of Lakeview Fundamental Elementary is to refine the intentional writing instruction, infuse writing across the subject areas and to increase the number of students scoring at high levels of proficiency. Exceed the district and state proficiency rate by a minimum of 10% points as measured by FSA.
3. The mathematics goal of Lakeview Fundamental is for all students to achieve at least one year's worth of growth. Decrease the number of students scoring in the lowest 25% and increase the number of students scoring at the proficient level or above as measured by FSA,
4. The Science goal of Lakeview Fundamental Elementary is for all students to exceed the district and state proficiency rates by a minimum of 10 % points as measured by Common Assessments in non-testing grade levels and by Science FSA.
5. The STEM goal of Lakeview Fundamental Elementary is to secure funding of our third year of a STEM Academy. The goal also includes the involvement of more teachers as facilitators and further participation of students in the lowest 25% to increase learning gains.

6. Close the achievement gap between Black and non-black students to our AMO 2015 targets;

Reading AMO will increase to 70- 100% of students exceeding the district and the state in reading and in math. All students in the sub group will reach high levels of proficiency on the Florida Standards Assessment. The same is expected for the area of science.

The core instructional strategies included in our plans are: Implementation of the Marzano Framework, SCALES that support the Florida Standards, Close Reading Strategies with Reflection in all subject areas, small group work with independent practice for differentiation, Gradual Release Model, the use of Success Criteria and the Science Learning Activity Guides . Professional Development once a month in the form of one hour seminars that focus in on Florida Standards, effective strategies, formative assessment, strategies for increasing scores and methods of tracking student data in all subject areas. The professional development efforts include the use of teacher leaders and the LLT to develop training that centers around the strategies for improving student learning gains. Cooperative Planning Training will occur once a month throughout the school year to explore new ideas and share across grade levels. We will also use this time to tour on site grade level classrooms. On site Professional Development Days will be shared with another fundamental elementary school to share planning, strategies and expand on Domain 4. Our focus for the year is Vertical PLCs, Deliberate Practice further implementation, formative assessment and the increased tracking strategies of student data. We will also utilizing TDEs for teachers to visit classrooms off campus and to plan as teams. The parent involvement efforts are effective at Lakeview. Families are required as per Fundamental Policy to participate in specific parent meetings and to attend a minimum of three conferences per year. These policies help to ensure that parents are well versed in the learning that takes place in their child's classroom. Our parents are dedicated to the education of their children beyond what is required by policy. Parents can be found on a daily basis volunteering in classrooms, providing support for teachers through Adopt a Class/ Materials, sponsoring special events through our very active PTA to raises funds that support academic achievement and the like. Our families embrace the fundamental environment and it is evident through their efforts.
