Executive Summary: Forest Lakes Elementary

School Improvement Plan for 2017-18

Forest Lakes Elementary School has 499 students grades Pre-k to 5th, two administrators, 46 teachers, and 23 staff members. The mission of Forest Lakes Elementary is: Forest Lakes Elementary—A Community In Pursuit of Highest Student Achievement. Forest Lakes Elementary has met the requirements of the AdvanceD Accreditation Commission and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Council on Accreditation and School Improvement.

School Celebrations

A review of our most recent school achievement data has given us reasons to celebrate and build upon as a school. Those improvements include:

- 1) Our school improved its FSA math gains for L25 students by 13 percent.
- 2) Our school improved its FSA ELA gains for L25 students by 10 percent.
- 3) Our school improved its FSA math gains 10 percent.
- 4) Our fourth grade students improved their FSA math proficiency by 14 percent.
- 5) Our fourth grade student math proficiency score was the 6th highest in our district.

Primary Goals

To accomplish our mission Forest Lakes has the following primary goals:

- 1) To increase proficiency in ELA by 10% in each grade level, and to increase school proficiency to 76%, as measured by Florida Standards Assessment and MAP.
- 2) To increase learning gains for L25 students by 10% in ELA, in each grade level, as measured by Florida Standards Assessment and MAP.
- 3) To increase proficiency in Mathematics by 10% in each grade level, and to increase school proficiency to 82%, as measured by Florida Standards Assessment and MAP.
- 4) To increase proficiency in Science by 15% in each grade level, and to increase school proficiency to 76%, as measured by Florida science state assessment.
- 5) To reduce the achievement gap between black and non-black students by 20%.
- 6) To reduce the achievement gap between ELL and non-ELL students by 20%.
- 7) To reduce achievement gap between ESE and non-ESE students by 20%.

Key Strategies:

The core instructional and monitoring strategies included in our action plans are:

- Regularly assess (both formally and informally) and use data to plan differentiation, intervention, and scaffold
 instruction to increase student performance.
- Utilize iStation with L25 students.
- Utilize Effective Mathematics Teaching Practices.
- Establish routine practice of the 10-70-20 Instructional model for students.
- Develop and implement a 5th grade standards review plan based on data from the 3rd/4th grade Review Diagnostic Assessment.

Professional Development

The professional development efforts include ELL Data and Strategies, Restorative Practices, TQE/Rich Math Task Unit Planning with math coach and training with content area coaches for selected teachers.

Parent and Community Engagement

Parent engagement efforts provide parents with academic resources to increase and enhance student achievement. The school provides an FSA training, kindergarten round up, and student led conferences. All teachers share data with parents by holding face-to-face conferences and/or providing periodic data reports in writing. PTO family involvement focuses on fun academic events such as our annual Family Stem Night, music concerts and poetry celebrations.
