Complete 5 <b>DreamBox</b> lessons.	Find as many words as you can that end with the blend /th/.	Using a book, the Internet or a TV show, <b>observe</b> how animals look like their parents but have <b>variations</b> . Write or illustrate how they are alike and different (color, size, etc.).	Act out one of your favorite stories and have someone record you talking like one of the characters.	Count to 120 starting at 65.  Count back to 20 starting at 40.
Draw a box and then sketch a present that might go inside. Label the parts of the present. Then write a sentence to tell who the present would be for.	Today's number is 15. How many ways can you make 15? EX: $15 = 20 - 5$  Challenge: Can you make 15 using three numbers?	Demonstrate using objects around the house how we can change the motion of that object using a <b>push</b> or a <b>pull</b> .	Play a board or card game with a family member.  Record the name of the game you played.	Write as many words as you can in 1 minute.
Choose 3-5 household objects and have your child <b>predict</b> if that object will <b>sink</b> or <b>float</b> .  Test their predictions using a bowl/container filled with water.	Read one book every day or have someone read a book to you.		Choose a book that you love. Read the book with someone and then make a new cover for that book.	On a clear night, look up at the stars. Talk about how many <b>stars</b> are in the sky (more than anyone can easily count) and how they are spread out in the sky (scattered unevenly). Discuss the tool that <b>astronomers</b> use to study and observe the stars ( <b>telescope</b> ).
Make a New Year's resolution. Write it on a piece of paper and tape it on the wall to read every day.	<b>Code.org</b> Complete 2 lessons.  Record the code you wrote to complete an activity and describe what happened.	Make <b>observations</b> of a living thing using as many of the <b>five senses</b> as possible.	Go on a hunt for coins around your house.  Name all the coins you find.	Create an illustration showing how to stay safe around water.
Go on a Shape Scavenger Hunt around your house or neighborhood.  Draw and label the shapes you see.	Write a thank you note to someone for a gift you have received.	Complete <b>5 more</b> <b>DreamBox</b> lessons.	Identify some things in the world around us that happen <b>fast</b> and some that happen <b>slowly</b> .	Take a walk through the neighborhood to look for squirrels. Make <b>observations</b> and record where you saw the squirrels. (Were they on the ground, in a tree, or somewhere else?)
