Empath Health Patient and Family Training

Six additional training hours after completion of Volunteer Orientation. This training prepares you to visit patient/family members within any of our Empath Health programs. Additional specialty training may be required depending on the visit type. Upon completion of training and when all onboarding requirements are met, you are eligible to volunteer in the following areas:

Companionship Visits

Visit a patient in an assisted living facility, on an on-going basis with a small group of teen volunteers. Offer companionship to patient while engaging in a specific activity of the patient's interest.

- Read Aloud Sessions
- Collaborative Art Projects
- Play an instrument or sing together
- Play board games together

Cheer Teams

Group of teen volunteers visit multiple hospice patients in an assisted living facility. These visits occur on an ongoing basis. Offer companionship, supportive listening, and bring "cheer" to each patient you meet.

Child & Family Support Programs

Work directly with children affected by an illness or death of a loved one.

- Homework assistance and/or tutoring
- Companionship support visits

Party Pals

Celebrate special occasions like birthdays and anniversaries with patients. Weekday afternoon opportunities.

Lifetime Legacies

Help capture patients' life stories.

- Interview patients while recording (video and audio) patient memories and life experiences
- Scrap booking
