Your final presentation must include all of the following required elements. Use the space below to make a note of each item to help organize your research.

Required Elements	Notes
Research Question A question that explains what was studied	
Notes from Research Different sources annotated, highlighted, and notes from student ideas collected	
Cite your Sources/Documentation Sources chosen (title, link) from at least three different mediums (website, book, video, podcast, speaker, etc.) and how you knew the information was reliable	
Conventions/Grammar Accurate spelling, punctuation, capitulation, grammar, and sentence structure	
Final Research Project: Summary Overview of research topic - similar to the back of a book. Summary does not give away findings.	
Final Research Project: Introduction Must include a hook, research question, and your reasoning for picking the question	
Final Research Project: Results Explain the results of your research and what you learned in relation to the research question.	

<p>Final Research Project: Figure or Data What figures (images, graphics, photographs, etc.) or data (tables or graphs) support your research?</p>	
<p>Final Research Project: Conclusion Summary of the research question and results.</p>	
<p>Final Research Project: Presentation The information is presented in a clear and engaging format that conveys the information.</p> <p>** Projects presented in a digital format must be converted to a display board if chosen to represent their school in the District Science Showcase.</p>
