Close the Gap by Raising the Bar Joint Gifted & ESOL Project Spring 2015

Goal

To increase the number of students from underrepresented populations identified as gifted.

Rationale

• The percentage of ESOL and other economically/ethnically diverse student groups screened and identified as gifted does not reflect the population of the Pinellas County student body. Typically, students are screened for gifted at the request of their teachers or parents. Referring bright students from underrepresented populations is often difficult for teachers because they often do not recognize their non-academic strengths such as problem solving ability. Parents of these students are also often unaware of gifted characteristics and services available to them. As a result, bright students from underrepresented populations often do not reach their potential because no one recognized their ability.

Proposal

To use the Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test – Second Edition (NNAT 2) to screen all general
education first grade students for gifted in the schools with the highest percentage of ESOL
students. The selected schools are: Belleair ES, Dunedin ES, Eisenhower ES, McMullen-Booth
ES, and Skycrest ES.

Overview of the NNAT2

- Nonverbal method of testing based on progressive matrices that require no verbal or written answers.
- The test is brief and consists of 48 items that require reasoning and problem-solving skills rather than reading, word knowledge, or math ability.
- Group administration takes approximately 45 minutes, 30 for the actual testing.

Plan

• First grade teachers will administer the Naglieri to all general education first graders. For best results, make the grade level screening a team effort including the gifted teacher.

Review the NNAT 2 and goals for grade level screening in a PLC Classroom teacher administers the NNAT2 in the classroom setting. Teachers score NNAT2 during a PLC

Students who score at the 90th percentile or higher will be considered for further evaluation.

Timeline

• April 20-30

Meet with first grade team & gifted teacher about the project NNAT2 protocols / test directions delivered to schools via pony Pre-screening letter sent to parents

May 1 – 20

NNAT2 administration and scoring Post screening letter sent to parents Students scoring at or above the 90th percentile are referred for further evaluation
