The following is an action plan that identifies crucial next steps for effective use of the PSAT assessments as a tool for increasing college readiness, raising access to rigorous courses, and increasing post-secondary scholarship and/or credit articulation opportunities.

GOALS:

- Administer the PSAT 8/9 to at least 90% of all 8th grade students and the PSAT/NMSQT to at least 90% of all 9th & 10th grade students to inform student course selection, curriculum revisions, and professional development offerings, and to increase student participation in courses of rigor.
- Increase student access to college opportunities as measured by National Merit Semifinalist, National Achievement and National Hispanic scholarship recognitions; and Advanced Placement (AP) credit.
- 3) Increase achievement levels of minority students as measured by the PSAT 8/9 and PSAT/NMSQT.
- 4) Increase the percentage of minority students in advanced courses at the middle and high school levels by 10%
