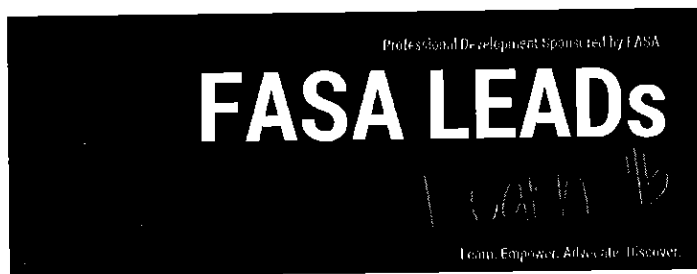

June 9-11 Session Descriptions

A 3-day rotation covering 3 topics: All participants will be divided into 7 groups with approximately 50 administrators in each group for professional development. Participants received an e-mail with course number and room locations.

June 9: Marzano Teacher Evaluation Model, Domains 1-4

(location – Admin Building and Pinellas Park H.S.)

Participants will conceptualize the connectivity and impact of the 4 domains within the Marzano Teacher Evaluation Model as it was built to grow teacher instructional practice through feedback. Participants will learn the power imbedded in a Common Language of Instruction and intentional use of instructional strategies. The participants will become familiar with the observation tool or protocol. Elements or instructional strategies will be studied through the idea of a dominant element or desired effect.

Pilot Schools: Data Driven Focus on Student Achievement

This session will focus on those actions and behaviors that ensure everyone in the school has a clear focus on student achievement that is guided by relevant and timely data. Participants will learn how to use data to drive their school improvement plans, professional development, and how to target and set the right school improvement goals based on data.

June 10: Inter-rater Reliability Feedback and Scoring

(location – Admin Building and Pinellas Park H.S.)

Participants will learn that feedback is the central component necessary for teacher growth while exploring the difference between formative and summative feedback. The sessions will explore research, but is anchored in practical examples and tips to support instructional leaders to be successful throughout the feedback cycle, including how to best use iObservation for feedback. A deeper look into scoring will place a heavy emphasis on the use of the scale to identify a teacher's current level of implementation of a strategy.

Pilot Schools: Continuous Improvement of Instruction

Participants will learn what actionable feedback is, what it looks like, how to provide it, and how to use it to improve the quality of instruction. They will also learn to recognize those strategies that can be frequently used in rigorous instruction to meet the new Florida Standards.

June 11: Going Deeper with Data using Decision Ed, Performance Matters, and Climate Surveys for SIP

(location – Stavros Building)

This session is differentiated according to school levels (elementary, middle and high school). Participants will take a deeper look into Performance Matters, FSA assessment and accountability and using Cycle Assessment to improve instruction. Participants will have opportunities for hands-on activities that include data mining and SIP work sessions.
