Teachers of world languages use best practices and state standards to facilitate

Beginning Spanish for Adults

Thirty-five adults representing many schools and offices from throughout the district participated in a six-week Beginning Spanish course held at Perkins Elementary School. Teachers, Sylvia Amaya, Lillian Lewis, Sandra Rosado and Maria Wyatt, planned and presented the series of workshops to enable interested administrators, teachers and district staff to acquire basic communicative phrases in order to help them communicate with the Spanishspeaking children and their families served regularly at their sites. Some of the participants included classroom teachers who work in schools, such as Bay Point and Perkins, which the students are learning Spanish. They participated in the class in order to better facilitate the Spanish instruction in their schools, where students receive daily Spanish instruction

The two-hour weekly classes included presentation and practice of key phrases and vocabulary, practice with technology, and mini-grammar lessons. A highlight of each class was a cultural lesson built around food, which participants prepared and sampled. Dance and music was another integral part of the learning experience. The course was so popular that another has already been planned. It will begin **March 16 and run through April 27** (LMS #8004008C)

Amaya, Lewis, Rosado and Wyatt, all national board certified teachers, teach the class as a service to the district, for which they receive credit for mentoring hours. Many individuals from around the district have requested that similar classes be held in other locations in the district. The office of world languages is hoping that other national board certified teachers will be willing to form a class at a different location.

La Familia Contenta Grows
