

NEHS Latin and German Students Excel in Competitions and National Exams

On Saturday, February 18, four students from Northeast HS joined 500 area students at Tampa Preparatory School for the Region VI Latin Forum. Participating students were Keylon Lovett (2nd in 100 meters, 5th in Mythology II) and Konstantin Kerekovski (along with Keylon, 2nd in the 3-legged race and 5th in Latin I derivatives) and Sable Mongold (1st in Latin II derivatives). During spring break, four NEHS students attended the state Latin Forum in Orlando. Konstantin Kerekovski placed 9th in Latin Vocabulary I, Eric Lentz placed

9th in Latin derivative I, and Keylon Lovett placed 8th in History of the Empire II. In March, eight students from NEHS joined 125,000 from around the world to participate in the 2006 National Latin Exam. In Latin I, Kristen Hoots earned magna cum laude and a certificate, while Konstantin Kerekovski and Troy Toon earned maxima cum laude with a certificate and a silver medal.
