Forever Our Teacher, Our Friend *Carmine Zinn*, 1935-2007

Teachers and former students of world languages as well as friends and administrators from throughout the district continue to mourn the loss of a dedicated educator, mentor, master teacher and dear friend, Carmine Ranieri Zinn. Carmine passed away Sunday, March 25, in the home of her daughter, Lisa, in Warsaw, Indiana. She had been valiantly living with Amyotrohic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS), also known as Lou Gehrig's Disease. Carmine was a graduate of St. Petersburg High School and Florida State University. She taught Spanish from 1957-1986, first at Meadowlawn Junior High School, and later at Northeast and Pinellas Park High Schools. She served as supervisor of foreign languages for the district from 1986 until she retired in 2000. As supervisor, Carmine was responsible for initiating Foreign Language Field Day, publishing the first Polyglot and for starting elementary foreign language instruction in Pinellas County. Carmine also taught Spanish at St. Petersburg College. Carmine truly impacted the lives of those students and teachers she served, leaving the kind of legacy that will not fade. Throughout this past year, many marveled at the way she continued to reach out to others, teaching all who surrounded her how to gracefully deal with life's most daunting challenges. A funeral mass and memorial reception will be held at the Cathedral of St. Jude the Apostle Catholic Church in St. Petersburg at 1:00 p.m. on May 12.

Spanish Students and Teachers Among Special Honorees

A group of student honorees representing this year's 42 National Merit Semifinalists, Hispanic and Achievement Scholars from Pinellas County Schools was recognized at a breakfast held April 19, at the Harborview Center in Clearwater. Among those students and educators were Nicholas Bradley, Dunedin HS, and his teacher, Gail Barrett as well as Hayley Germack, St. Petersburg HS I.B. Program and her teacher, Gloria Muñoz.

NEHS German, Latin and Greek Students Participate in National Exams

Five Students from NEHS participated in the 2007 National German Exam with 24,000 others from around the country. Mirza Tajic answered 92 out of 100 questions correctly on the Level II exam, and Medissa Medic answered 96 out of 100 questions correctly on the Level III exam. Both will receive a medal from the National Association of Teachers of German. Six students also participated in the National Latin Exam in March, competing with 134,000 students from 13 countries.
