St. Petersburg High School Students Score Well on National Spanish Exam

Congratulations to several world language students from St. Petersburg High School who attained national recognition for excellent performance on the 2008 National Spanish Examinations. Students from Ana O'Brien and Gisela Torres' Spanish II classes earned a total of 15 gold, 8 silver and 2 bronze placements along with 2 honorable mentions. "Attaining any placement or honorable mention for any student on the National Spanish Examinations is very prestigious," said Kevin Cessna, National Director of the Exams, "because the exams are

the largest of their kind in the United States with well over 106,000 students participating in 2008. "The National Spanish Examinations are administered each year in grades 6 through 12, and are sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese. Six St. Petersburg High School students scored in the 99th percentile, the highest in the nation, with seven more scoring in the 98th percentile. O'Brien and Torres hope to involve even more students in this national competition in future years.
