LOCKSMITH TECHNICIAN

MAJOR FUNCTION:

Performs skilled master mechanic level work in the maintenance, repair and installation of a wide variety of locks. Opens locked doors, safes, file cabinets, and related items where key or combinations are missing. Reviews specifications, hardware schedules and blue prints. Work is performed independently under general supervision and is reviewed upon completion through results obtained.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Installs, maintains, rebuilds, and replaces locks, door closers, tumblers, panic devices, and related hardware.
- Disassembles locks and repairs or replaces worn tumblers, springs, and other parts; makes and installs new parts as required.
- Rekeys locks and other hardware; cuts new or duplicate keys manually or by use of a code machine.
- Changes safe combinations, installs new safes, repairs defective safes. Inspects locks and determines defects and needed repairs; applies solvents and lubricants when necessary.
- Opens locked doors, file cabinets, drawers, and related items for which there is no key using tools of the locksmith trade; may be required to open combination safes by listening to lock sounds or by drilling.
- Answers school security emergency calls for building or room access during hours and after hours as needed.
- Reads and interprets blue prints, hardware schedules, and specifications for plan reviews for compliance with State Requirements of Education (SREF).
- Conducts substantial completion, warranty, and quality control inspections on all new construction, remodel, renovation, and maintenance type work.
- Inspects and ensures highest quality products, craftsmanship, and records are being utilized.
- Maintains simple records on time and materials used.
- Determines supply stock needs and places reorders; reviews material requisitions of other locksmiths for accuracy.
- Lifts heavy objects on a routine basis.
- Performs minor carpentry work as needed.
- Applies knowledge of standards and procedures of the locksmith trade and safety requirements of SREF in performance of job duties.
- Observes safety precautions; properly cares for tools and materials of the trade.
- May be required to service electric and electronic locks and hydraulic door closers.
- Surveys facility needs as they pertain to master key systems.
- Develops master key systems, bitting list, and other key codes manually or by use of specialized computer software.
- Leads, trains, and assigns work to others in trade.
- Performs related work as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Graduation from high school or possession of a GED, plus six (6) years progressively responsible experience as a locksmith, performing most of the above mentioned duties and responsibilities. The successful completion of up to four (4) years of verifiable formal training in the trade (vocational, military, or indentured apprentice school) may be substituted for a like amount of the experience requirement. Possession of a valid State of Florida Class E noncommercial driver's license, and any other license as may be required by law.
