# Attendance is the number one predictor of student success.

• Attendance to date is up 2.1% over last year – and our senior class is 7% ahead of last year at this time. We encourage you to encourage your student to be in school. With block scheduling, missing one day is equivalent to missing two days on a traditional schedule.

• Our Cambridge Academy had 73 families list us as their first choice – the highest number in the program's history. Our Academy of Entertainment boasts more total one and two choices in its history at 227.

• Last summer, we expanded our Culinary Academy and added a restaurant. We have been working diligently and are putting up the finishing touches, adding décor and student work.

• Our Academy of Entertainment Arts is scheduled for a complete makeover as soon as school gets out on May 25th with brand new classrooms in settings that are conducive to our Entertainment program. Digital Film, Music, Gaming/3D Design and Photography will all be housed in a building that will reflect the exquisite quality of work produced.

• Our February projected graduation rate is up 10% ahead of where we were this time last year.Our year-to-date attendance rate is up 2.1% from the same point last year. We are making progress in both and working in collaboration with our parents and students. We believe we will continue to improve and make gains in those areas

• ELP – our Extended Learning Project after school every Monday through Thursday to 4 pm in the Media Center has continued to grow in support and attendance. Students are afforded "one stop shopping" for all of their core academic needs. Math, Social Studies, English and Science teachers are there every day to assist students in homework, test preparation and study skills.
