AP Capstone students participate in districtwide symposium

Junior Liam Smith has been known to procrastinate a time or two throughout his high school career. So, when he was provided the opportunity to do a mock run-through of his AP Research presentation three weeks ahead of schedule, he jumped at the chance.

"It really helped me get everything together," said Liam of attending the AP Capstone Symposium with 117 other students from nine high schools on March 28. "I was able to really solidify my line of reasoning while preparing for today and I got some really good feedback from my peers and teachers."

This year's symposium is the first in the district since 2019. The Pinellas County Schools Advanced Studies department partnered with University of South Florida St. Petersburg to give AP Research students the college experience, as well as an opportunity to present and receive feedback on their presentations, which they will give before their teachers in a couple of weeks. Students from Countryside, St Petersburg, Osceola Fundamental, Largo, Seminole, Hollins, East Lake, Pinellas Park and Palm Harbor University high schools participated in break-out sessions, heard from two keynote speakers and also got to question a student panel with representatives from the Honors College and the Innovation Scholars Program.


