Discussion: What advice do you have for Sam and his friend?

Week 4

Situation: Working in a cooperative group, each person had a specific job to do. One member of the group was not contributing to the group's goal.

Dilemma: On one hand they could attempt to solve the situation within the group. On the other hand they could report to the teacher that one person was not cooperating. Discussion: What advice do you have for the group?

Start with Hello brings attention to the growing epidemic of social isolation and empowers young people to create a culture of inclusion and connectedness within their school, youth organization and community, by raising awareness and educating students and the community through activities, public proclamations, media events, student contests, and school awards.

Having Trouble Logging Onto iStation at Home???
