Change Phone/Email Contact Information

Follow these easy steps to update your telephone number and email address to be sure to receive important information from Pinellas County Schools.

1. Come to the front office during office hours (7:30AM-3:30PM) with a photo ID and get a Parent Portal

username and password. (You may already have one, if it is expired you will need to bring your photo

ID to the front office to reset the password).

- 2. Visit the district's website at www.pcsb.org.
- 3. Under the Site Shortcuts click **Student Registration.** There will be yellow and green boxes at the top

of the page and you will click the box that states Student Reservation System.

- 4. Log in using your Parent Portal ID and Password.
- **5**. Click on the statement that describes your child.
- **6.** Click on **Change Phone or Email Address only** link and follow the steps.

Ways to Report Absences to School

When your child must miss school, it is important to communicate with us for every absence! Below are different ways of notification.

- Calling the school (727)547-7668. Call each day the student is out.
- Sending in a letter to the office/teacher and/or sending in notes from doctor's appointments. Please always be sure to include your child's name, grade, teacher, date of absence and the reason for the absence so the absence can be recorded correctly. If the days are consecutive, one note for the date range will suffice.
- Going on the School's website and clicking on the Report Student Absence tab. Follow the steps listed below:
- 1. Go to Seminole Elementary School website: https://www.pcsb.org/seminole-es
- 2. Click "REPORT STUDENT ABSENCE" tab at the top right side of the page
- 3. Click the blue circle that says Report Student Absence and it will generate an email.
- 4. Fill out the email and be sure to include the student's name, DOB, grade, date absent, and reason for the absence.
