## Message From Mr. Cerreta

It is hard to believe that we are almost at the end of the first grading period. I appreciate all of the continued support as we maintain the academic momentum. Our work together is very important. Research confirms that parental interest and involvement in a child's education is the most significant reason children succeed in school.

One way to help your child to succeed in school is to read every evening. Students in grades k-2 should read 20-30 minutes each evening and 45 minutes for students in grades 3-5. Each teacher in grades 1-5 established an individual 9-week reading goal for every child. Your child's teacher sets the reading goal using the Accelerated Reader Goal Setting Chart. Point goals vary depending on your child's reading level. Parents can view and track their child's reading goals through AR Accelerated Reader. AR is software...a computerized reading management program. The AR program is a simple, three-step process. Students self-select a book, read the book, and then take a quiz on the book at the computer. All students should strive for an 80% or above comprehension average on AR quizzes.

Teachers enter individualized point goals and book level goals within the software and then use various reports to document students progress using the software.

An AR goal is set for each student based on a standardized test of reading assessment, past reading performance, and teacher evaluation. Students that reach their quarterly goals will be able to participate in our quarterly reading goal celebrations.

Students are also recognized by reaching their personal cumulative goals. See below:

### Message From Dr. McCafferty Assistant Principal

Dear Families,

Our students have finished taking Progress Monitoring 1 of the Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) test! Student results were sent home for you to view.

Regarding the results for PM1, just administered, and PM2 which will be administered in December, it is important to understand that this information is intended to provide baseline and mid-year results for PM1 and PM2 respectively. Therefore, for PM1 and PM2, students may not yet be at grade level; however, this does not necessarily indicate that a student is not on track to succeed. These results are for informational purposes only and are used for teachers and other instructional staff members who work with your child to identify areas that may need additional instruction and support. These results should not be considered student achievement designations. Alternatively, PM3 provides a summative score at the end of the year to measure student mastery of the grade-level content standards.


Guidance Corner from Mrs. Moore



As part of our bullying prevention program at Seminole Elementary, we speak often about being an "Upstander." An "Upstander" is someone that makes someone feel welcome or included, helps resolve a conflict, or helps someone who is being picked on.

As part of Start with Hello Week, at Seminole Elementary, we had an Upstander Jar competition. Each homeroom teacher received a poster of an Upstander jar to hang in their classroom. Throughout the week, when they caught one of their students being an Upstander, they put a sticker or a mark in the jar. At the end of the week, I tallied the results to find the two winning homerooms—one from PreK-2nd grade and one from 3rd-5th grade.

The winners for this round are Ms. Mucerino's first grade class with 73 Upstanders, and Ms. Kopkau's third grade class with 53 Upstanders! These two homerooms will receive donuts this week to celebrate their kindness, empathy, and conflict resolution skills. At Seminole Elementary, we "donut" stand for bullying!
