**Guidance Corner** 

Having vacation time together with family over breaks is a wonderful thing. Lots of time together can also include some conflicts. Here are conflict resolution steps I teach during classroom guidance lessons to help empower children to work through big emotions they may experience because of a conflict with

The first step is to calm down. If either party is still experiencing a strong emotion, they are not ready to talk through what happened. Taking deep breaths, getting a drink of water, coloring, or drawing, going outside for a quick walk, or having some alone time may help.

Once both parties are feeling calm, they can take turns sharing how they are feeling. Naming feelings accurately is such an important part of the process! Did they feel angry, sad, hurt, frustrated, embarrassed, or something else? Both parties should face each other and make eye contact. Using a "talking piece" to help remember whose turn it is to talk helps as well. This could be a stuffed animal or a marker or whatever is convenient

is convenient.		
To make it simpler,	have them fill in	the blanks:

"I feel	when you	
What I want is		"

After each child shares how they're feeling, the other one repeats what they heard to make sure they were listening

If they don't want the same thing, they can brainstorm ideas for a compromise.

The conversation ends with each of them filling in the blank to this statement: "Let's agree to\_\_\_\_\_."

For fun, have them make up a special handshake they can do with each other for the rest of the day!

I hope you all make many wonderful memories this holiday season, with many conflict-free days. If conflicts do arise, don't worry, they can be wonderful opportunities to practice an important life skill.

Dear Families,

Our FAST PM2 window closed 12/20, and our students worked very hard to show all they have learned so far this school year.

You received your child's scores reports this week which share how your child performed, or a way to find their scores. Please ensure you sign and return the paper indicating you have seen the report. If you have any questions for your child's teacher or for me, please write them on that paper as well.

The Department of Education has included levels for all grade levels so K-5 families will see a level included in the report. These levels are outlined below:

Level 1 - Substantially below proficiency

Level 2 - Below proficiency

Level 3 - Proficient

Level 4 and 5 - Above Proficiency

At Seminole Elementary, we work hard for everyone to be at or above proficiency (Level 3 or higher). If your child is a 3 or higher on PM2, that's great; they can still make growth within those levels and show even more learning gains. If your child is a level 1 or 2, please work with your child's teacher to see what you can do at home to support your child in achieving proficiency.

#### How to help kids become more fluent readers

Reading fluency is the ability to read at a good pace, with accuracy, and with the right expression. Fluent readers also understand what they're reading. Here are some ways kids can improve their fluency:

- Listen to models of fluent reading, like read-alouds. Audiobooks can also be great models of reading fluency.
- Practice sight words so kids can automatically recognize words. https://www.understood.org/en/articles/what-aresight-words
- Have kids read a short text at their reading level several times. Count how many words they read correctly in one minute. Record the results on a graph. Repeat several times. (This is called "repeated readings.") Soon they'll see that their speed and accuracy improve.
- Read a sentence together. Then draw slash marks to "chunk" the text into meaningful phrases of three to five words. Kids should take a short pause at the slash marks when reading.

#### PT Corner - From Ms. Meyer

Research has shown that children who regularly do chores tend to develop stronger life skills and a greater sense of responsibility compared to those who do not participate in household tasks. A study published in the Journal of Developmental Psychology found that children who contribute to chores at home often show improved self-esteem, better time management, and a stronger work ethic. By performing chores, children learn the importance of completing tasks, taking ownership of their responsibilities, and understanding the value of contributing to the family unit. This involvement not only boosts their confidence but also teaches them practical skills, such as problem-solving, multitasking, and following through with commitments, which are all valuable as they grow older.

On the other hand, children who are not given chores may miss out on these critical developmental benefits. Without the regular experience of contributing to household duties, they might struggle with self-discipline and a sense of accountability. Research indicates that children who do not engage in chores are more likely to develop entitlement behaviors, expecting things to be done for them without taking initiative themselves. Furthermore, the lack of participation in chores may affect their social skills, as they may not have the opportunity to work collaboratively or understand the concept of shared responsibility. In contrast, involving children in chores helps them build essential life skills that promote independence, cooperation, and a strong work ethic, all of which can lead to greater success in school and later in life.
