Message From Dr. McCafferty **Assistant Principal**

Does your child have a Progress Monitoring Plan (PMP)? A PMP is a specific, detailed plan tailored to identify individual assistance that will be given to remedy a student's individually diagnosed deficiencies. The PMP is an active working document that reflects what is being done to help remediate a student's deficiencies. The PMP intervention process is a continual process that occurs four times during a school year (August, Cycle 1, Cycle 2, and Cycle 3). Families of students with a PMP from their last year's data already had a PMP generated, shared, and signed.

Students with data that generates a PMP from Cycle 1 of the current school year, will begin to have these PMPs shared with families for review and signatures. If a student had an August PMP but is making progress during the benchmarks in their current grade level, the PMP with teacher and parent input, the PMP can be faded! This means the child may not need the specific additional interventions that were in place because they are showing progress.

To support your child's success in reading, math, and science proficiency, please ensure they are reading for their required minutes, practicing their math facts, and exploring the fascinating world around us!

Attendance Matters!

Regular attendance helps children feel confident, connected, and successful at school.

- Arriving on time is important—being just 10 minutes late each day adds up!
- Help your child get enough sleep and plan morning routines ahead.
- Celebrate milestones: consider a small reward or praise when your child comes to school on time every day for a week.

Social-Emotional Focus: Managing Big Emotions
Children experience many feelings—excitement,
worry, or frustration. Helping them name and manage
emotions is key to success at school and home.
Tips for Families:

- Ask your child to name their feelings each day: "How are you feeling today?"
- Model calm responses when frustrated.
- Teach a "calm down corner" at home or simple breathing exercises:
 - O Take 5 deep breaths
 - Count to 10 slowly
 - O Stretch or move around

Art News



Artists in 5th grade are studying visual texture, and can use it to draw and watercolor a dragon or monster eye. In 4th grade they are studying architecture and creating spooky houses with a watercolor background. In 3rd grade, they beccame art scientists and mixed paint colors to create tertiary colors to complete a color wheel. After that they cut out the color wheel and turned it into a eye with spider webs around it. Second grade artists have been studying symmetry and the Mexican holiday Dia de Los Muertos that uses sugar skull decorations. They are touching on the culture of Mexico by creating an "ofrenda" table setup with the sugar skull in mixed media. In first grade we learned how to mix 2 primary colors to make a secondary color and painted pumpkins that when cut collage paper was added, turned into Jack O lanterns! In kindergarten, students studied shapes and turned traced and cut out shapes into "shape monsters" with drawn and cut out details. In the photo on page 4, you see a giant check being presented to the Art department from Curlew Hills Funeral Home because 4th graders participated in a remembrance of 9/11 art exhibit.

OT News - Mrs. Myers

Handwriting doesn't come easily to all students and practicing it too much can make them not like it!

Does your student struggle to write? Many students started writing even before kindergarten and often learned incorrect letter formations which can eventually make it hard to write legibly especially when writing has to be done in a shorter amount of time. Encouraging the correct letter formations early is key. When practicing at home, keep sessions short with the emphasis on making it fun! Here are a few FUN ways that you can practice handwriting skills at home with

Use dry erase markers on a sliding glass door to practice writing letters of the alphabet or sight words they're working on in the classroom.

your child:

Use a cookie sheet with shave cream or salt to use a finger to write letters or words. Sidewalk chalk is a great way to practice writing skills. Try writing HUGE letters on the driveway or sidewalk and for an even better strengthening activity, use a vertical surface like the side of the house...just make sure the chalk will completely wash off the house first!

Use a spray bottle on "stream" setting to spray letters on to the driveway.

Shave cream on the wall during bath time makes a great opportunity to practice writing letters, one on each tile!

Designating an area of the bedroom for a chalkboard painted wall is a great way to let kids draw and be creative. Use a piece of woodwork mounted upside down on the wall as a tray for the chalk.

Write in the sand at the beach with sticks or

Tic Tac Toe using other letters beside just using only X and O. You could even do sight words instead of using letters.
