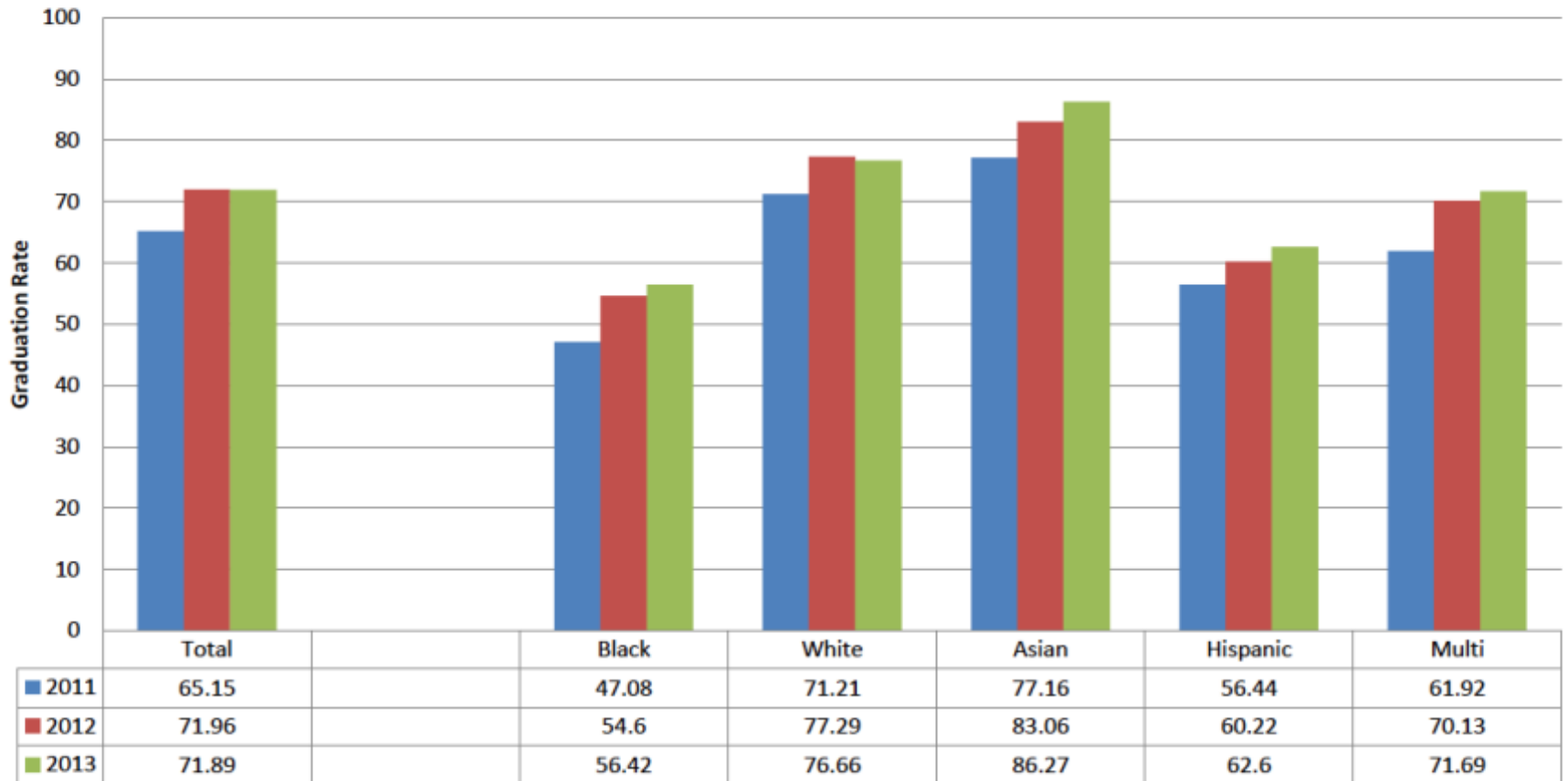

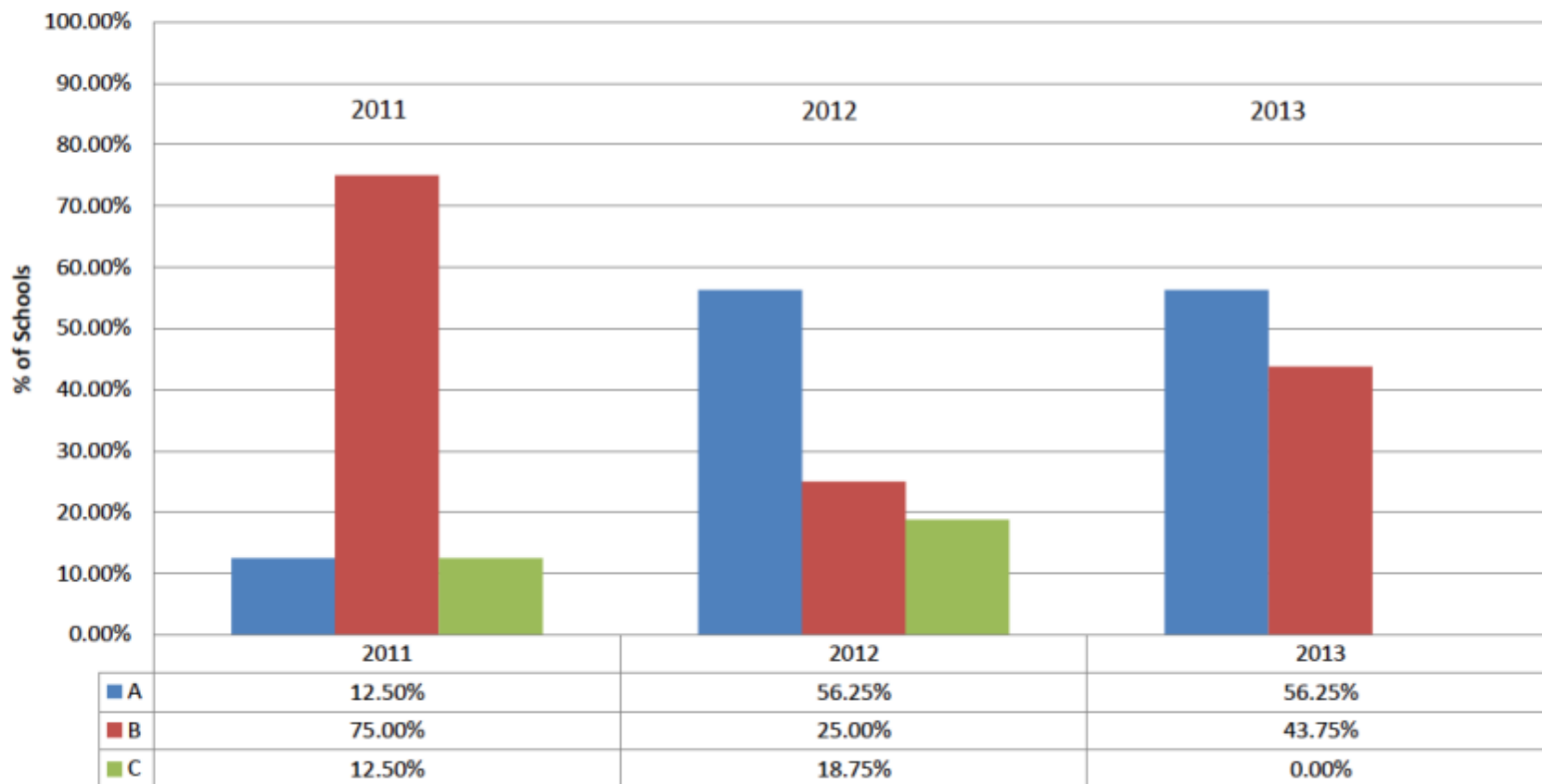
Graduation Rate Trend Data

Graduation Rate Trends by Student Group



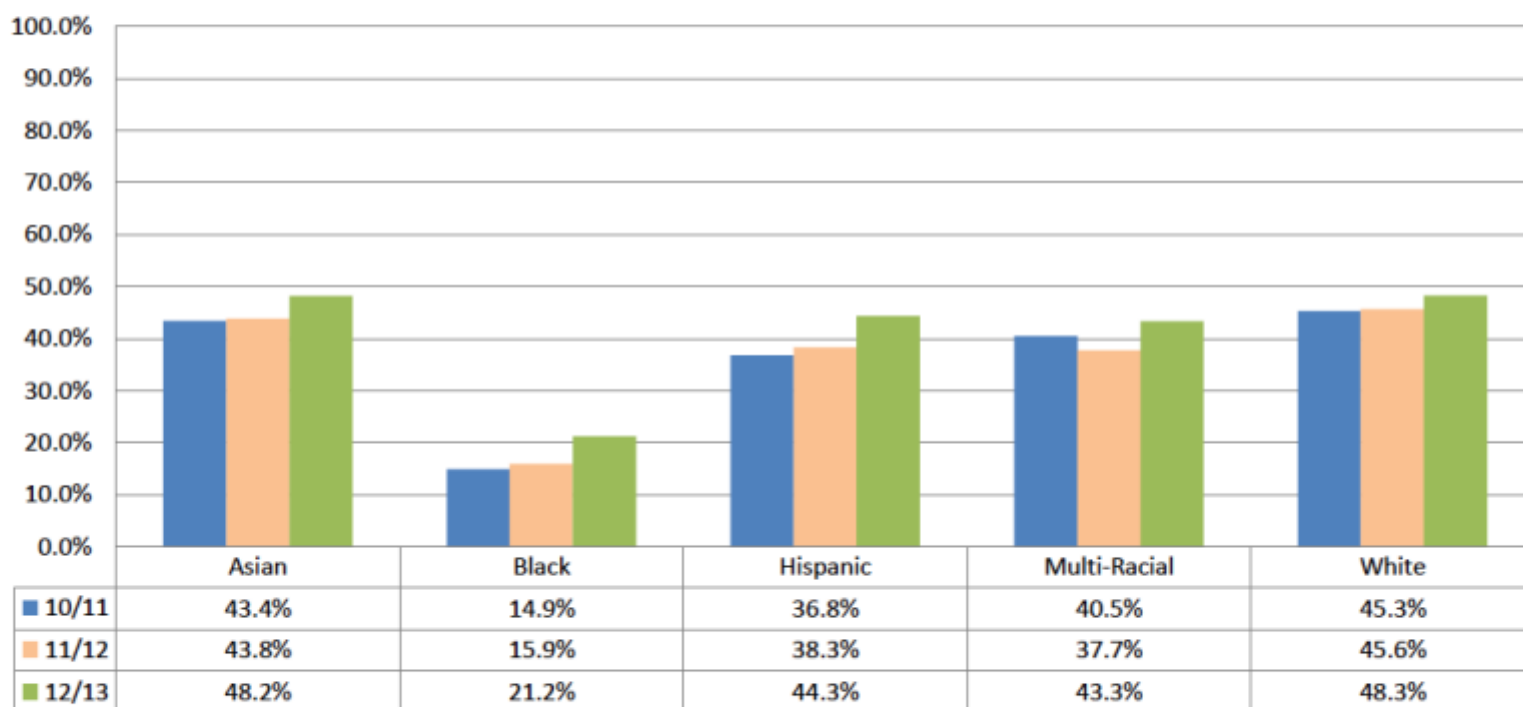
High School Grades Trend Data

High School State of Florida Grades



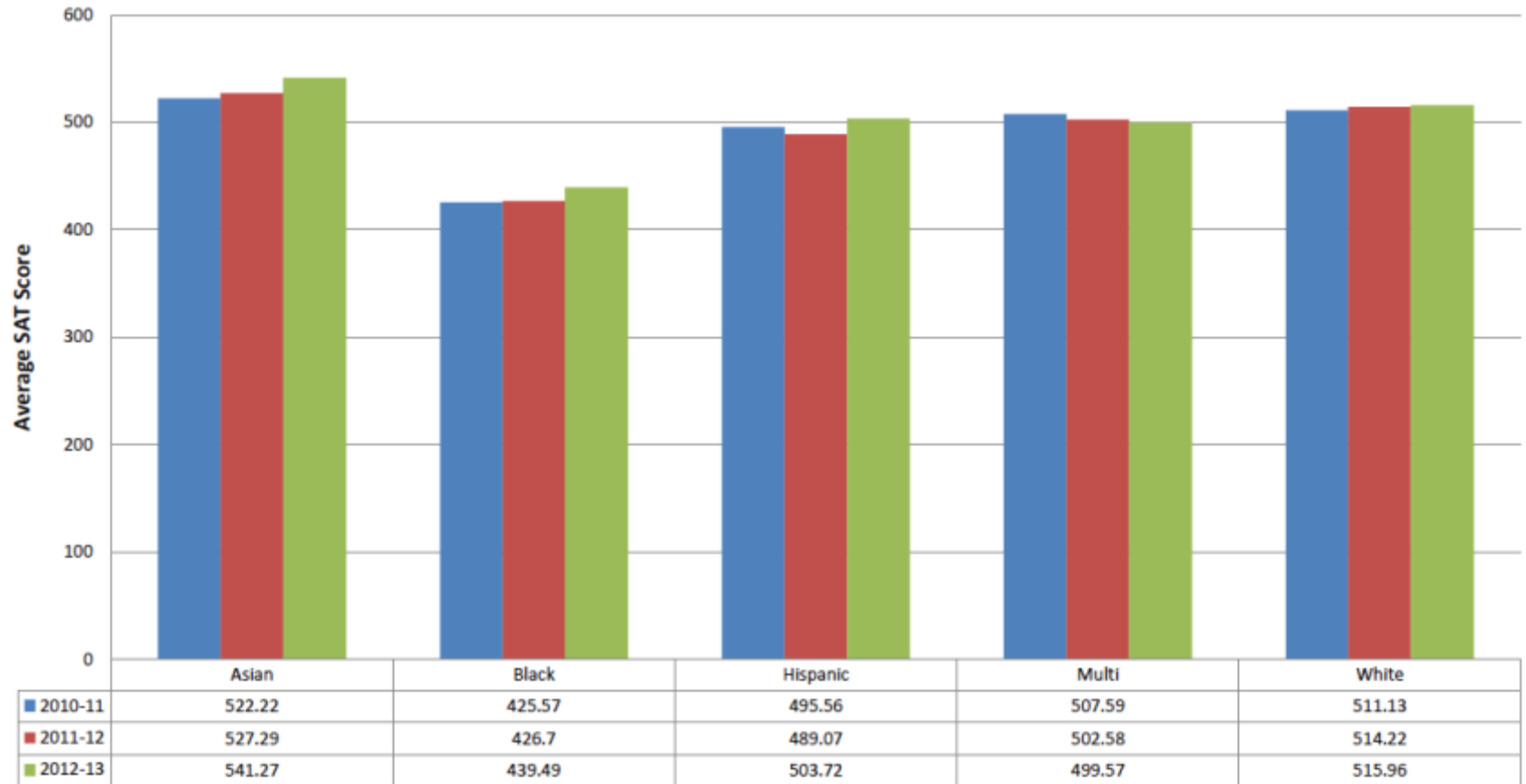
AP Pass Rate by Student Subgroup

Advanced Placement Students Passing AP Test by Student Group



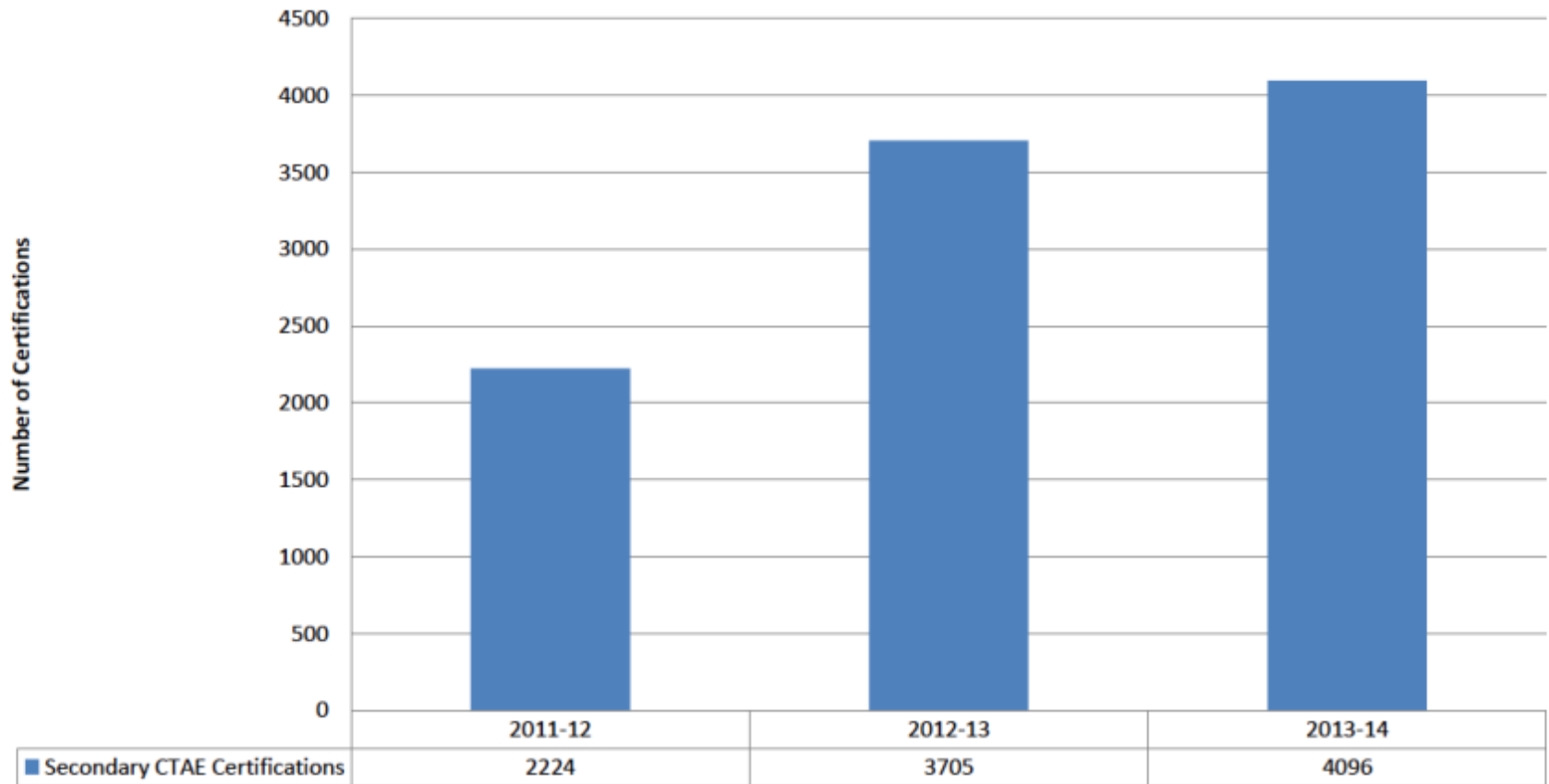
SAT Composite by Student Group

SAT Composite Scores by Student Group



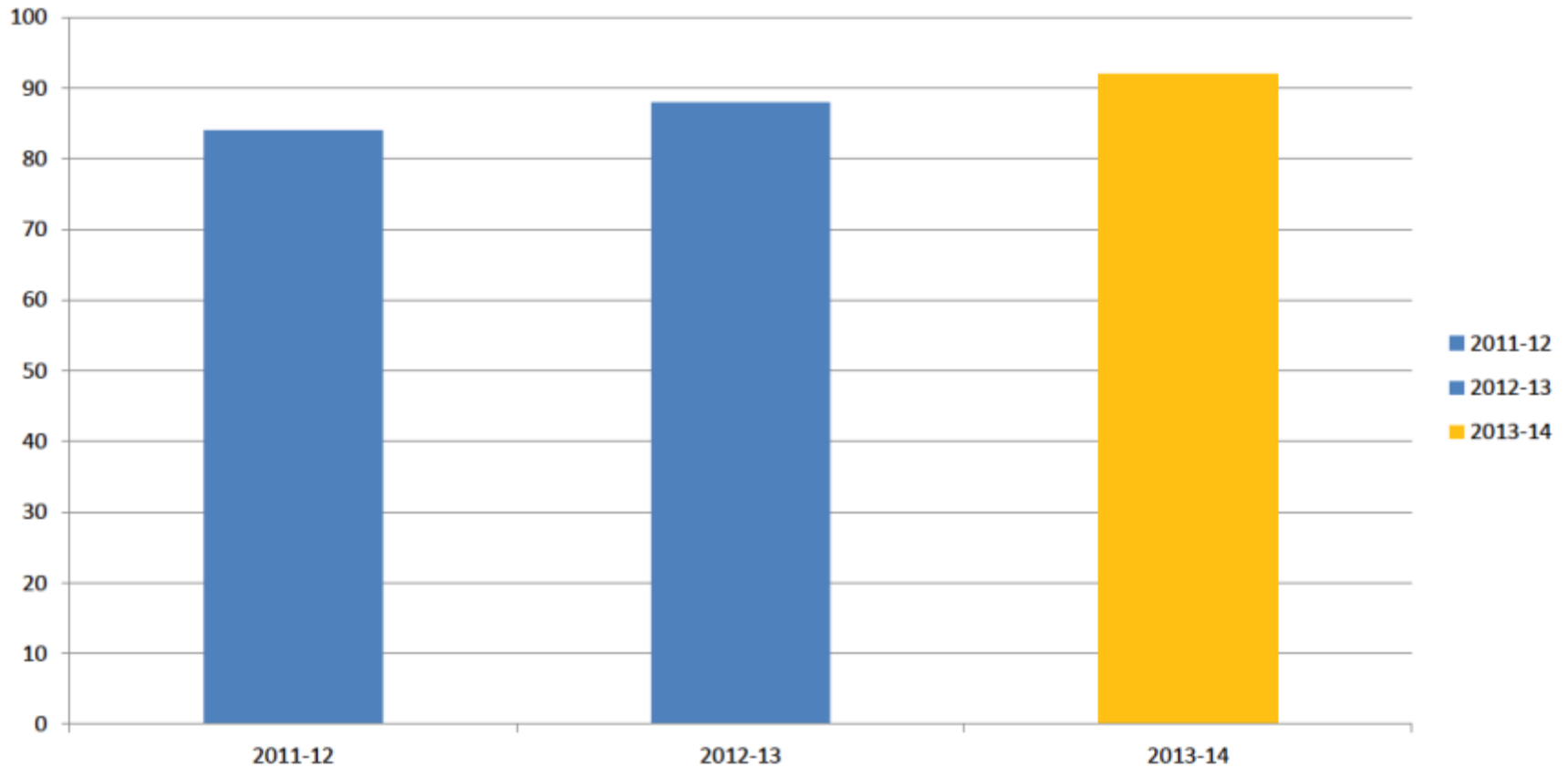

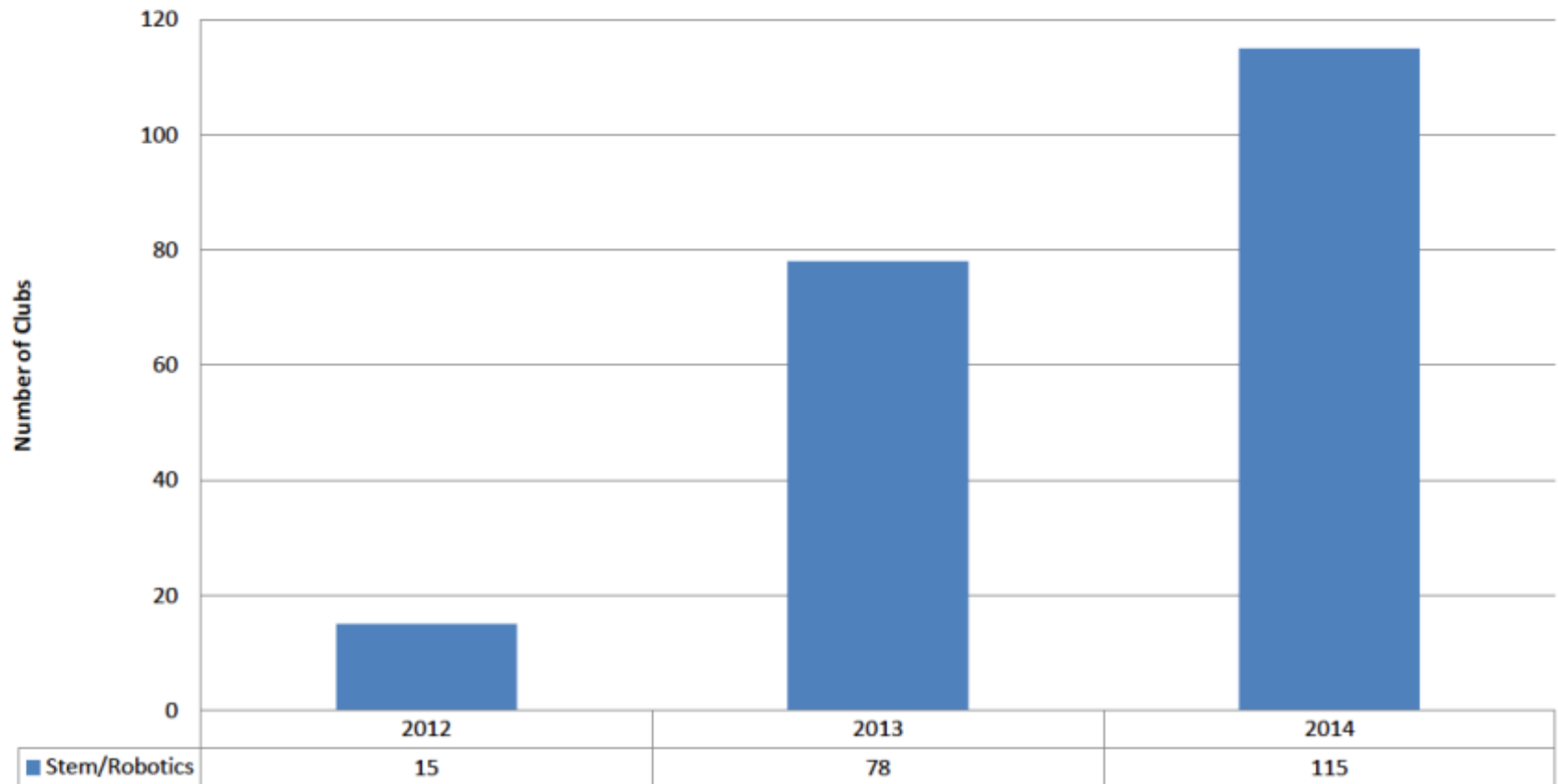

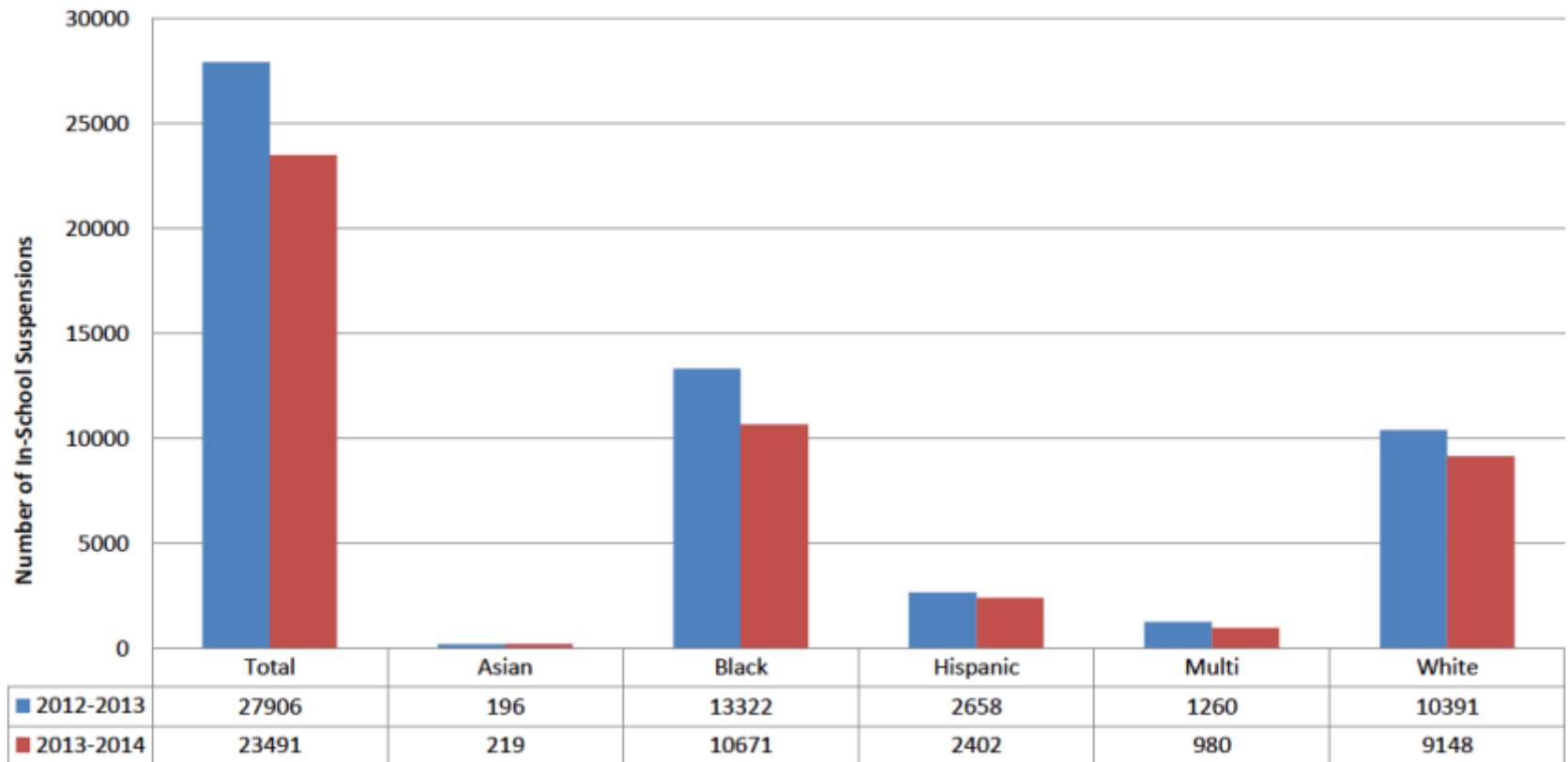

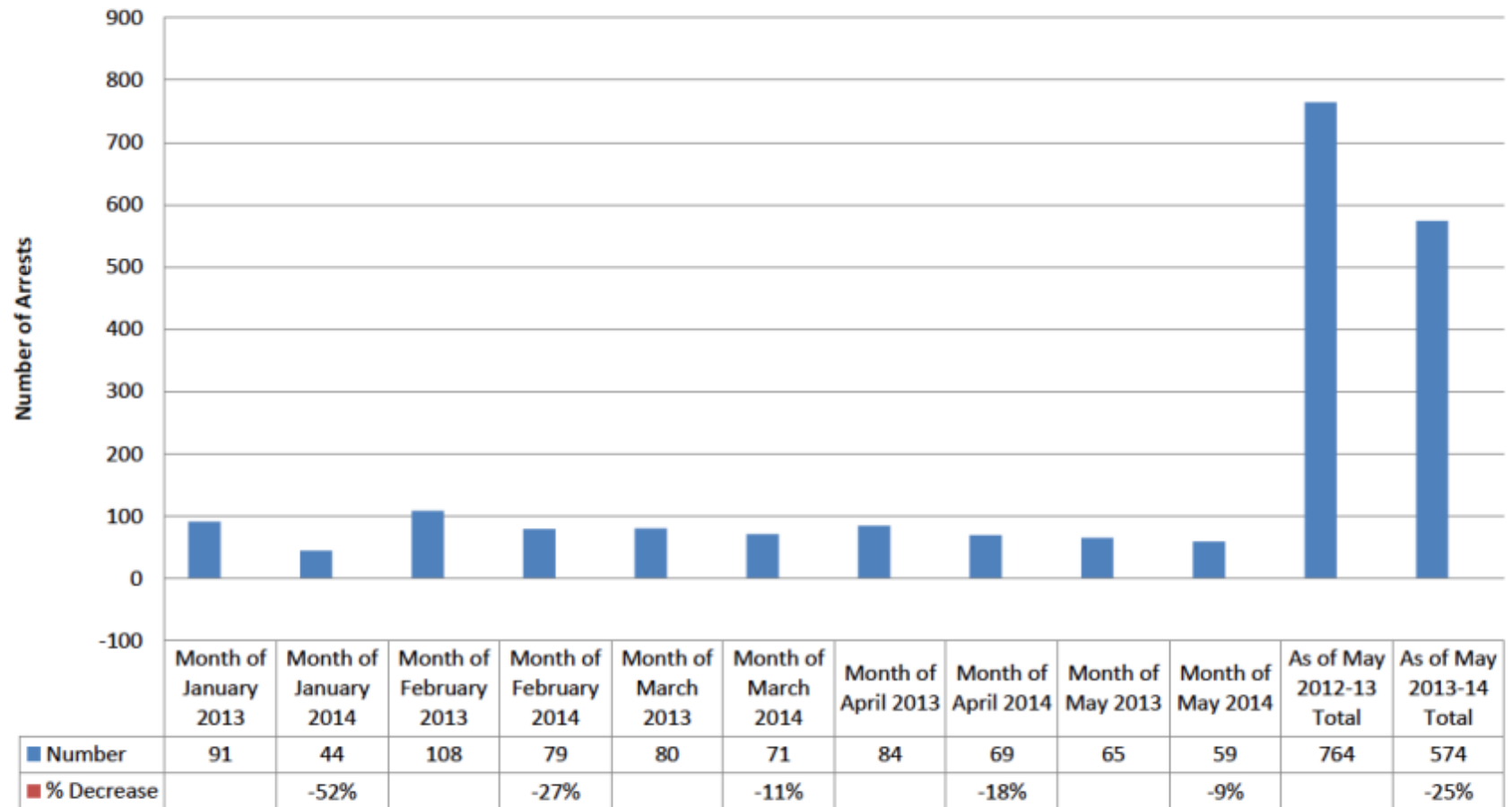
In-School Suspensions

Comparing August-March for 2012-13 & 2013-14



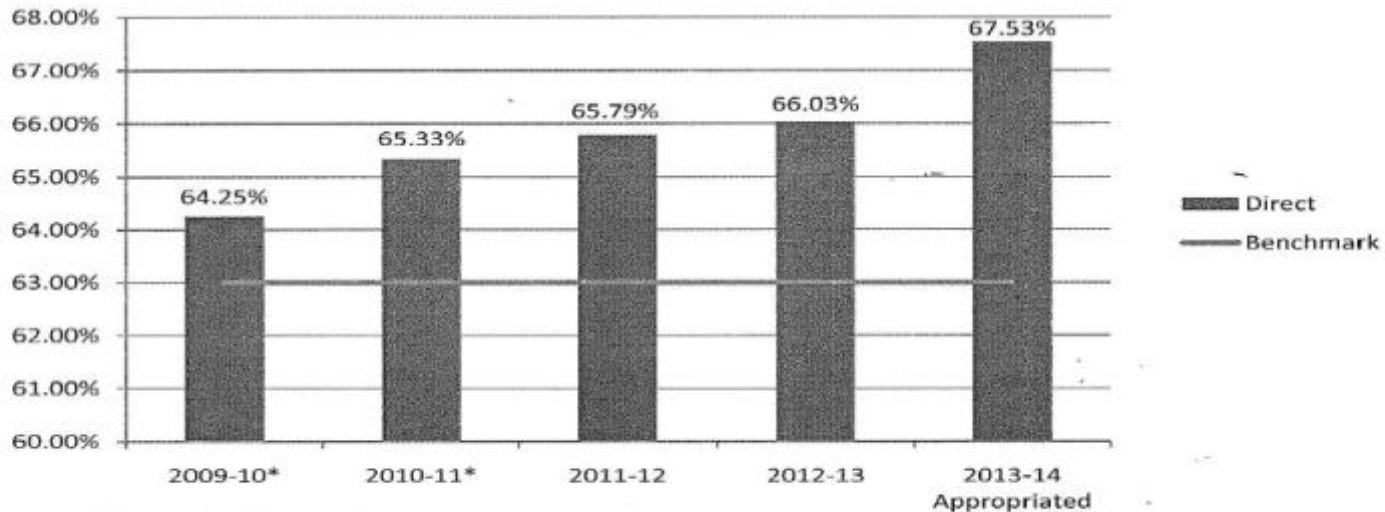
Decrease in Student Arrests

The best and worst districts for school choice

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New report ranks the districts that cater to school choice...and the ones that don't



According to a new report, there is more information available on what makes a school district not only suitable for school choice, but what differentiates the districts that are exceptional at catering to parental desires versus those that are simply mediocre. However, thanks to new data, districts across the country have been ranked in how well they cater to choosy parents.

Whether you support or oppose school choice—programs offering students and their families alternatives to publicly provided schools, to which students are generally assigned by the location of their family residence—the movement exists, and thanks to new data provided by the [Brown Center on Educational Policy at the Brookings Institution](#), parents and students now have a much clearer idea of which districts support school choice and which ones don't.

According to the authors of the report, the data compiled on districts around the country on school choice was needed, since support among parents, and states, for school choice is growing.
