#### Counselor's Connections





Welcome Back to School! As we begin a new academic year, I want to extend a heartfelt welcome to all students and families. Whether you're returning or joining us for the first time, I'm here to support your child's academic, social, and emotional growth. **Guidance Lessons:** I have been making my rounds into each classroom to introduce myself and let students know how to contact me. We discussed the Say Something icon on their computer. This is used to report bullying and if you hear another student make serious threats against the school or another individual. We also discussed that "words matter" and making threats against another student is taken very seriously.

**S.A.V.E Club** (Students Against Violence Everywhere) S.A.V.E Club will begin mid-September. Students were provided with a permission form to be signed by parents or guardians if they would like to participate. The S.A.V.E club meets once per month during the student's lunch. Our goal is to make the school a more welcoming place and learn about bulling prevention.

**Upcoming Events-**"Start With Hello Week"- Start with Hello week was founded by families who lost loved ones in the Sandy Hook Elementary tragedy. Each year, schools across the nation take part in this initiative to help prevent social isolation, bullying and violence by encouraging students to reach out, connect and include others.

#### Ms. Coleman's Book Nook

We're off to a busy start—getting reacquainted with the library and learning how to find the books we want to read! We'll learn tricks about finding those "just right" books to enjoy: not too easy, not too hard, but just right!

We're examining the differences between fiction and nonfiction and how both types of books can be found in libraries. Every book has an address printed on a label on its spine that tells where it is located in the library. This address is called a call number.

Fiction is organized alphabetically by the author's last name. A novel by Gordon Korman will have the call number "F KOR" on its spine. The F shows it belongs in the Fiction section, and the KOR, the first three letters of the author's last name, shows it is located on a "K" shelf. Picture books are located in the Everybody Fiction section and have a call number starting with "E" for the Everybody section. A picture book by Mo Willems would have the call number "E WIL" on its spine. It's going to be shelved towards the end of the Everybody section in the letter W's.

**Nonfiction is organized in number order.** The number stands for the book's topic of information. This is called the Dewey Decimal System and it organizes all the world's subjects into ten main categories (000s-900s). I sometimes call this the "secret librarian's code" but I help my students figure out the codes of their favorite subjects so they're in on the secret too!

Let's say I wrote a book about weather, it would be shelved in the 500s where all the physical science books are located. All weather books are in fact located in the 551s. If I wrote a book about hurricanes, a type of weather event, it would have the call number "551.55 Col" on its spine because 551.55 is the Dewey Decimal number for books about atmospheric phenomena, such as storms, hurricanes, and tornadoes. So cool, right! The "Col" part of the call number is because the author's last name is Coleman. Looking forward to teaching everyone more about the Dewey Decimal System or A.K.A. The Secret Librarian's Code!
