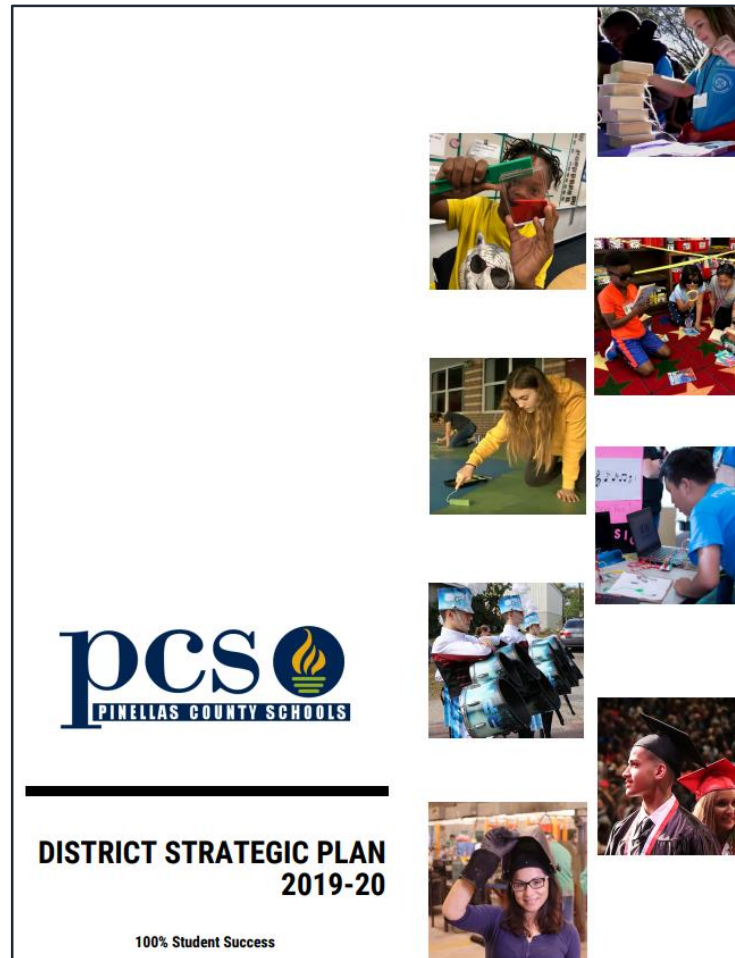

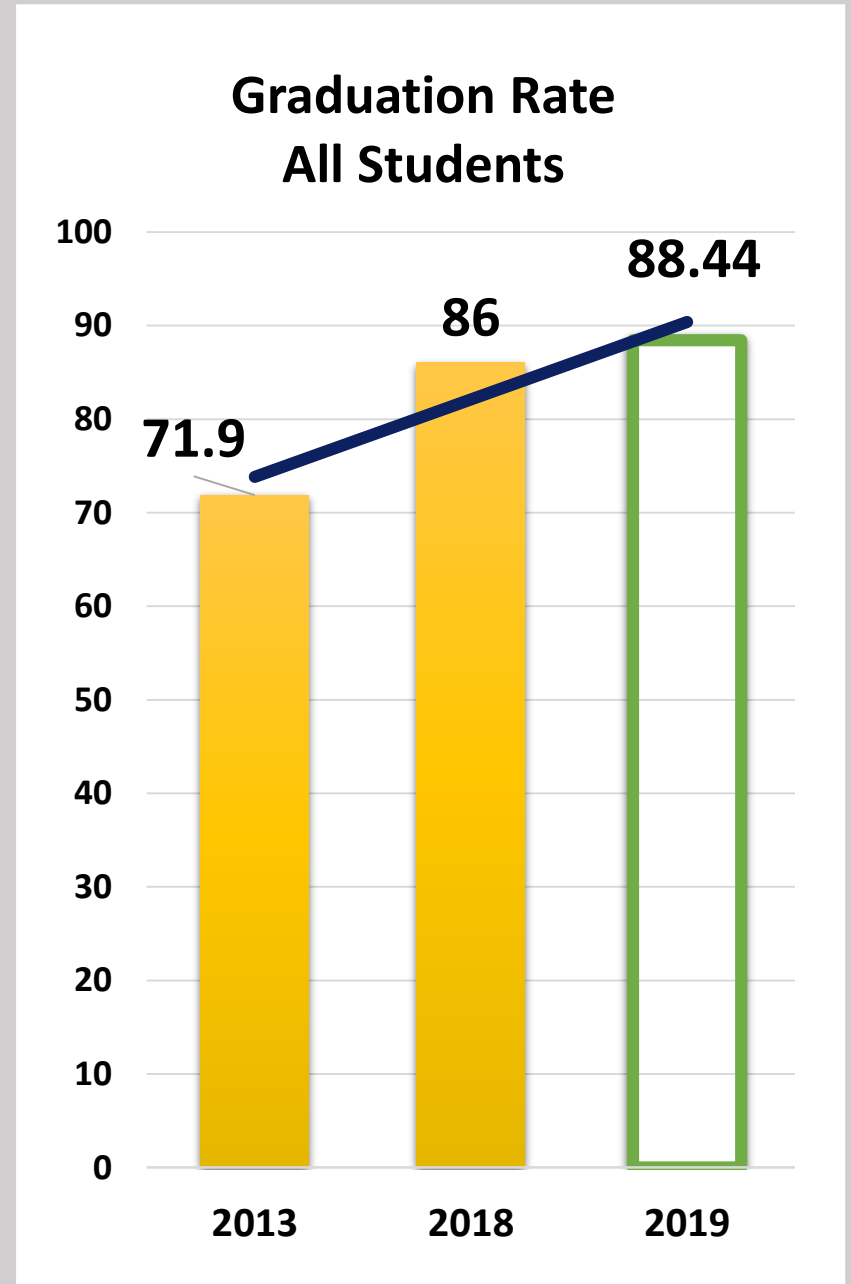

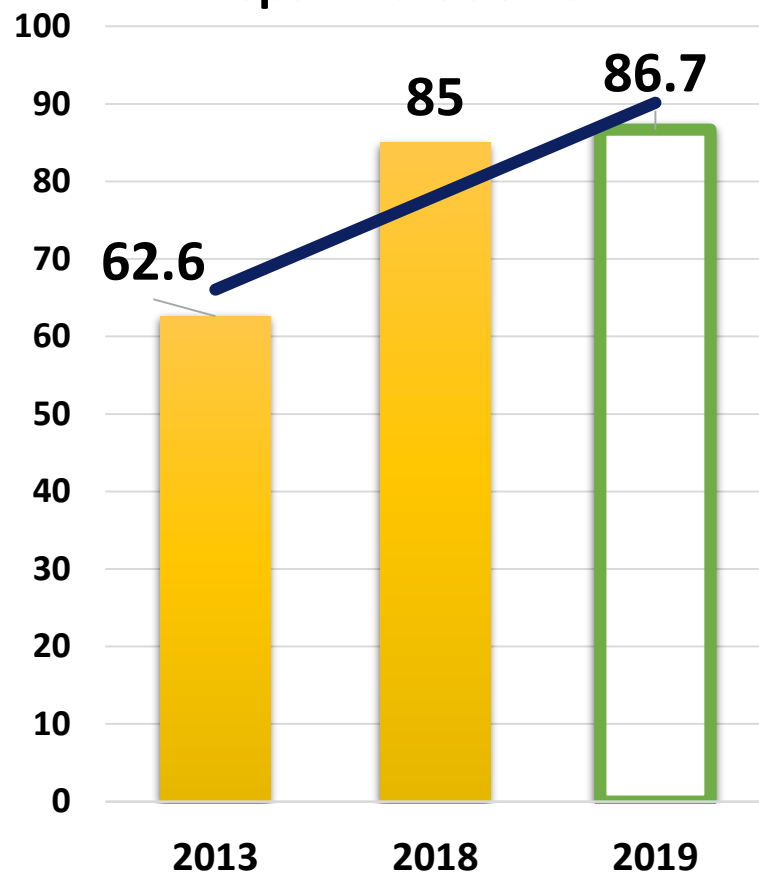


2019 Graduation Rates

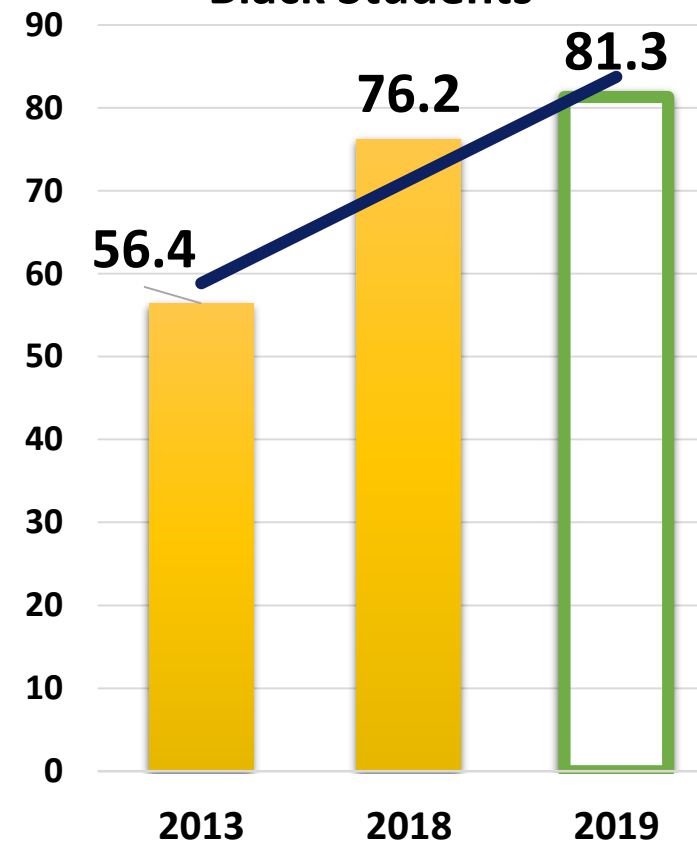

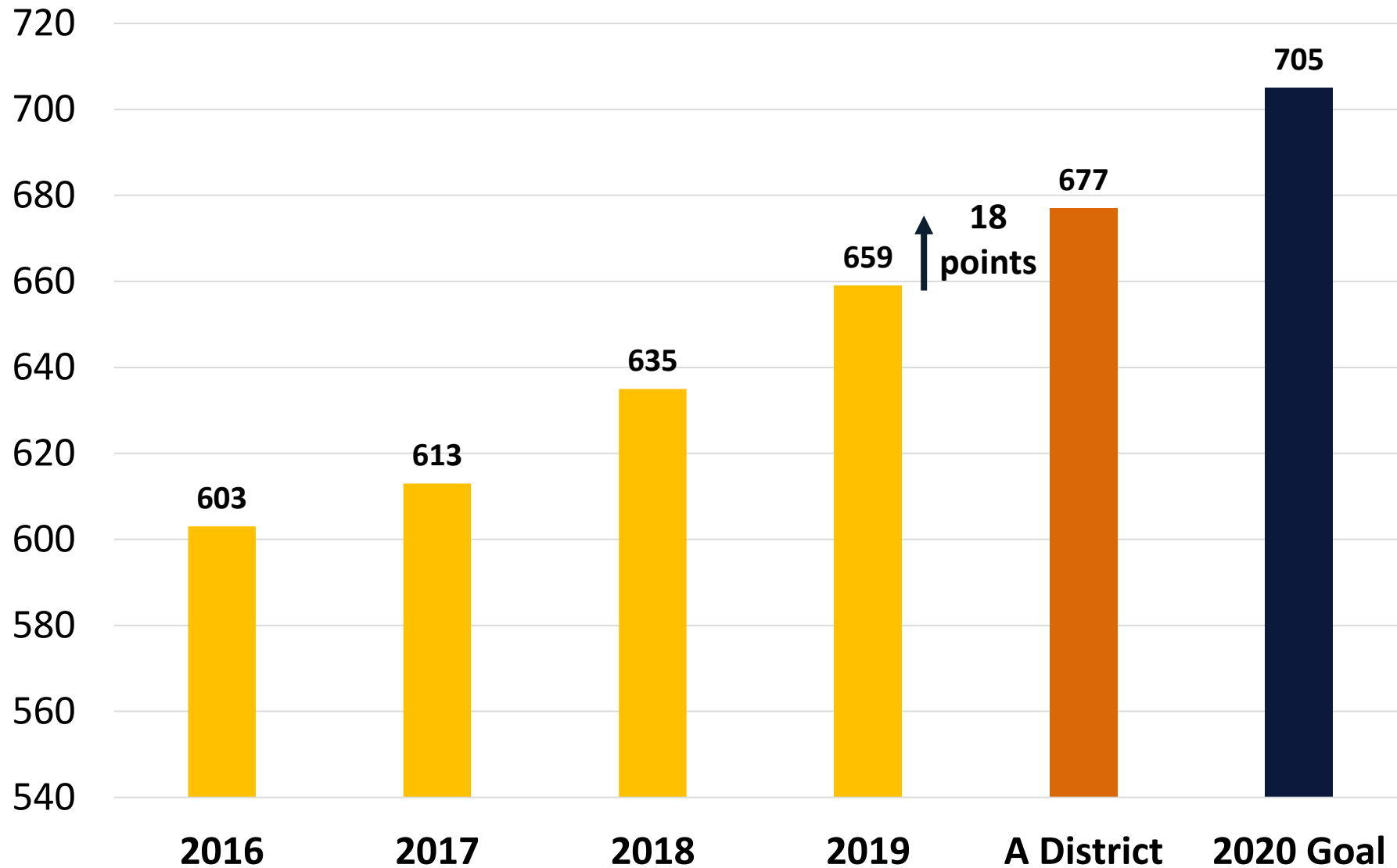

Taking the exam after completing an AP course is just one example of how your students are demonstrating commitment to rigorous academic preparedness. Nationally, only 39% of the Class of 2019 took at least one AP Exam. In contrast, **95% of AVID seniors from the Class of 2019 in Pinellas County Schools achieved this milestone.**

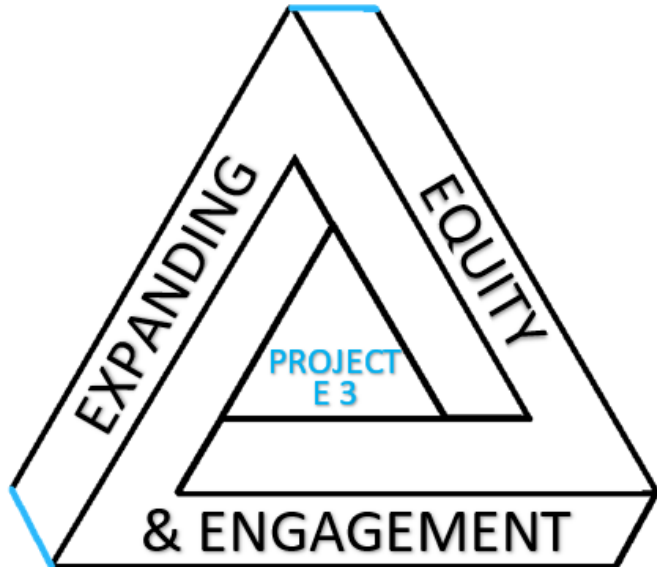

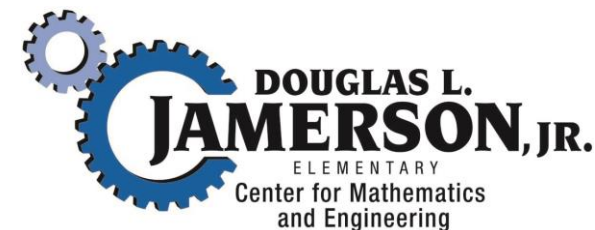

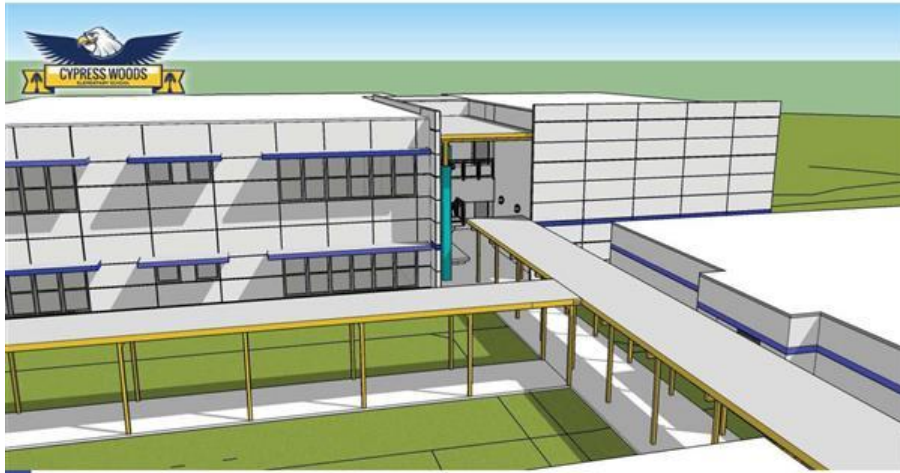
Students who do not enter kindergarten ready receive additional targeted and prioritized literacy supports to ensure 70% grade-level proficiency by third grade.
