

What is Therapeutic Recreation?

Therapeutic Recreation (TR) utilizes various methods and techniques to promote the independent physical, cognitive, emotional, and social functioning of individuals of all ability levels. Within the community, Therapeutic Recreation programs focus on promoting health, independence, inclusion, activity, and increased quality of life for all people with disabilities.

Step One

Complete the **Therapeutic Recreation Membership form**.

Step Two

The Certified Therapeutic Recreation Specialist (CTRS) will call you to schedule a Therapeutic Recreation Membership meeting.

Step Three

Working with the CTRS you will discuss your goals and then select which programs to attend.

Step Four

Stay-up-to date on everything TR by signing up for the <u>Monthly Newsletter</u>, which is sent the last Tuesday of every month at 10 a.m. and highlights all the upcoming programs.

Eligibility is evaluated by a Certified Therapeutic Recreation Specialist during a participant intake meeting and will be reviewed whenever necessary. Individualized behavioral support may be approved to maintain participant eligibility.
