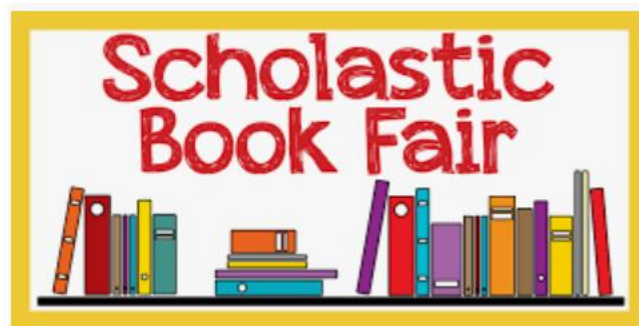


YOU ARE INVITED! Reading Under the Stars

Fifth grade only will take Science the week of May 12th.

Students who have vision problems detected will be given additional exams aboard the Vision Mobile and potentially given either glasses or a referral to a more specialized ophthalmologist. SICK KIDS — When to Stay Home from School:					
HEAD LICE Itchy head, active head lice	EYE INFECTION Eye is red and oozing a yellow or green discharge	FEVER A temperature of 100° or higher	RASH Body rash with itching and/or fever	COUGHING THAT WON'T STOP Or other problems with breathing	DIARRHEA OR VOMITING Within the past 24 hours
When to Return to School:					
After first head lice treatment	24 hours after starting antibiotic eye drops or ointment	Fever-free for 24 hours without the use of ibuprofen or acetaminophen	Free from rash, itching or fever and evaluated by doctor if needed	Cough is mild and infrequent and evaluated by doctor if needed	Free from diarrhea and/or vomiting for at least 24 hours and evaluated by doctor if needed

With the changing weather, we can expect an increase in cold and flu cases. We kindly ask parents to monitor their children's health closely. If your child develops a fever, please keep them at home. According to school board policy, students may return to school only after being fever-free for 24 hours without medication.
