PCS Continues to Elevate Academic Excellence

According to the Department of Education, Pinellas County Schools outpaced the state in many areas in the Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) Progress Monitoring 3 (PM3) testing. Some highlights include:

- Pinellas County Schools is first among the large districts in ELA proficiency and ranked 14th in the state across all school districts.
- Pinellas County Schools is third among the large districts in Mathematics proficiency and ranked 17th in the state across all school districts.
- Among the large districts in Grade 5 science proficiency,

prepared to share that message with their schools at the start of the year.

For the "Tech Talk" team from Safety Harbor Middle School, that meant developing a podcast addressing the issues of password protection and online safety. They will introduce the first episode – which features stories about getting hacked on Roblox and PlayStation – to the student body in August.

"It will go out during SOAR time (homeroom) at school," said Safety Harbor seventh grader Gio Rosado, who designed the team's logo and came up with the name of the podcast. "Hopefully (the students) can relate because we discuss a lot that impacts them."

The academy was created as an extension of the district's digital responsibility campaign, which began at the start of the 2024-25 school year. Students were encouraged to "Power Up Learning and Power Down Distractions" when the district's new cell phone policy went into place.


