Architecture students to become part of Dunedin High history

When Sram Muhqueed and Andrew Markowski first decided to compete in the Dunedin High School auditorium entrance redesign contest, they were excited, but not overly optimistic.

"We didn't take it super seriously at first," said Sram. "I thought it would be fun, but I thought we'd get fourth, maybe third place."

But the professional architects who judged the competition couldn't have been more impressed with the duo, who called themselves the Fountain Falconeers because of their incorporation of a fountain into their design.


"I was very inspired by their curiosity and level of creativity," said Jason Jensen with Wannemacher Jensen Architects. "For me, it was the thoughtfulness with which they approached this project – they thought of things we wouldn't necessarily consider because they are the ones moving through the campus."

The final presentations, held April 25 and April 30, were the culmination of months of planning. Twelve groups, who are all part of Dunedin's Academy of Architecture, Robotics and Construction Technologies, participated in redesigning the school's front entrance and auditorium areas with the understanding that one element from the winning design would be incorporated into the actual plan.

Alex Miniak is a 1995 graduate of the Lakewood High School CAT Program and is now the 'Voice of Petco Park' for the San Diego Padres.

It's been nearly 30 years since Alex Miniak graduated from the Center for Advanced Technologies and Communications (CATCOM) at Lakewood High School, but he still credits the program for providing a foundation for his broadcast success.

Miniak just began his 11th season as the "Voice of Petco Park" as the ballpark announcer for the San Diego Padres. He also "plays himself" as the announcer for all 30 Major League Baseball stadiums in the hit video game MLB The Show.

"When we did Fast Forward, that was truly the first thing that was on the air that I did," Miniak said during an interview from the lobby of his alma mater. "CATCOM really set me on my path."

After graduating from the University of Florida's College of Journalism and Communications, where he was an assistant program director for the on-campus radio station, Miniak took a position with a company now known as iHeartRadio. While there, he built morning shows and developed programs for radio stations all over the country.

Graci started the non-profit "Operation Military Matters" as a fourth-grade gifted project, but it has since grown into a passion. She gathers a group each month to help assemble and pack boxes containing toiletries, games, snacks, and personal notes and cards to send to miliary men and women. She has delivered more than 10,000 packages.

Graci has also played varsity softball, is senior class president and plans to attend Florida Atlantic University and major in sports broadcasting this fall.



St. Petersburg College offers two-year 'Promise' Scholarship

Between her academic achievements and her athleticism, Tarpon Springs High School graduate Kaytlin Kwapil had options when it came to deciding where to go to college.

But for her, being financially responsible superseded those options.

Like several hundred other 2023 Pinellas County Schools graduates, Kaytlin is finishing up her first year of college at St. Petersburg College tuition-free through the Promise Scholarship program. The Promise Scholarship started with last year's graduating class and offers graduates of eight Pinellas County high schools – Boca Ciega, Clearwater, Gibbs, Hollins, Lakewood, Northeast, Pinellas Park and Tarpon Springs – the opportunity to receive their associate's degree at no charge as long as they maintain a 2.0 grade point average.
