
June AHS Graduate Student of the Month from Clearview JOSH SMITH

June ESOL Student of the Month from Clearview KEMKOU CHHEUN







The article, titled "Successfully Passing the EPA 608 Universal Exam," gave a detailed analysis of the history, structure, and key topics of EPA 608 Universal Certification Exam, a crucial requirement for HVAC technicians working with refrigerants in the United States. The article also highlighted common mistakes that can lead to exam failure and provided practical recommendations on how to avoid those mistakes.
