Executive Internship Program

A Dual Credit, Experiential Education Success

The Executive Internship Program was introduced into Pinellas County high schools in 1974. Today, the Executive Internship Program is affiliated with a national organization of experiential education programs and has been nationally recognized as a model program by the U.S. School-to- Work office. Over 8,000 students in Pinellas County have participated in the program.

The program represents a unique blending of the business community, the local junior college and the public schools. It is available to eligible high school students during their senior year. The students spend an average of 10 - 15 hours a week working with a professional at decision-making levels in their future career field. Students are not paid by their sponsors, but they do receive high school elective credit and college credit from St. Petersburg College for their participation. The serious educational nature of the program requires that interns maintain analytical logs of their activities; participate in seminars; prepare college-level coursework and presentations demonstrating what they have learned during the internship; and submit a program evaluation.

From many cases of commonly seen and quickly treated carpal tunnel, to a rare and significantly more involved case where a patient had a severely infected wound after an ulnar osteotomy, **Ashley** had the opportunity to

learn about so many different medical conditions, and no matter how much she learned, there seemed to be a never-ending supply of information for her to continue to study. Beyond all the specifically medical information, the internship taught Ashlev that her long-standing interest in orthopedic surgery (and medicine in general) remains valid in an applied setting, which helps her more confidently commit to obtaining the necessary, lengthy, and expensive education that she must complete before she can become a surgeon herself.

Tommy Craig perform tasks, she began to complete tasks on her own. Zoe started with smaller and easier tasks, which included preparing ice bags and equipment bags before the games started. From her observations. **Zoe** knew how to properly prepare the ice bags to lay flat, to later conform to a knee or ankle, and to ensure there was no air in the bag so it was easier if the bag was taped to an athlete. As **Zoe** performed tasks, such as taping athletes before the game or helping wrap ice to the injured player, she observed the everyday skills and responsibilities that came along with the role of an athletic trainer. Throughout her internship experiences, Zoe learned that the field required one who could quickly react to situations and support an injured athlete confidently. The knowledge she has gained, taught her that she would be interested in pursuing a career in the field.

Isabella Biama had the experience of interning at Countryside High School in the athletic training department under BayCare Certified Athletic Trainer, Angel Witham. During her time with Ms. Witham. Biama

experienced the everyday duties of an athletic trainer. Isabella observed injuries as little as a scrape on the knee to a broken collar bones. After many weeks of observing, listening, and talking through rehab routines and stretches Isabella assisted in stretching players and getting them through their rehabilitations. Throughou this experience Isabella learned that an athletic trainer does much more than tend to injuries when they happen, they also provide injury prevention precautions, such as taping and stretching, and they provide emotional and mental support to the players. Isabella expressed that she has a new respect for athletic trainers because she feels as if they are under appreciated for all the great work that they do. As **Isabella's** internship came to an end she reflected highly upon her experience and knowledge that she learned along the way that has influenced her to explore more career options in sports medicine.

While being supervised by Kelly Moffitt of the Bay Dermatology and Cosmetic Surgery, Camryn Boyette realized that working at a medical office takes more than just daily patient visits. Instead, there is a large amount of paperwork, confidentiality, and team work that is involved with every professional working there. into making a physical therapy practice run smoothly, like the importance of insurance and paperwork that takes place behind the scenes. During her time spent at Select Physical Therapy, Bridget learned valuable communication and observation skills while shadowing the therapists in action. Throughout the course of her internship, Bridget's interest in pursuing a career as a physical therapist has greatly increased.

Under the supervision of Chief Josh Stefancic at the Safety Harbor Fire Department, Station 53, Sophia Orbesen observed the daily roles as a firefighter. Sophia rode along in the firetruck, learning by observing the variety of different calls that the fire station had received. Firefighter **Doug Smith** pointed out that the majority of the calls that fire stations receive are for medical purposes and not for fires. Not only do firefighters perform firefighting duties, but they have to partake in regular house chores as well. Before each shift begins at 8AM, the crews have a checklist of chores such as sweeping and

mopping the firehouse, wiping the counters down and other disinfection that is completed. Sophia learned the hierarchy of the Safety Harbor Fire **Department** which begins at the base level as a Firefighter Paramedic, all the way to the Fire **Chief** position. Each of the firefighters made sure to keep **Sophia** in the loop by explaining the medical information for each call in order to ensure that she fully understood what was taking place. Although the pandemic limited Sophia from any hands-on work, she still received a wonderful experience, allowing an expansion in knowledge which has pointed her in the direction to discover what she wants to do as her future career in the medical field.
