THE EXECUTIVE INTERNSHIP PROGRAM HISTORY

The Executive Internship Program began in Pinellas County in 1974. Since its origin many changes have occurred; a name change, formally called Community Leadership, association with a national network of similar secondary programs has been established, the numbers of students has increased, and the scope of the program has greatly expanded. Over 1,000 students have participated. Below is a sampling of their comments regarding their Executive Internship experience.

The Executive Internship Program provides high school seniors in Pinellas County Schools with the opportunity to intern in community businesses and professional areas for one semester of their senior year. Interns are with their sponsoring organization five days a week. Twice a month they attend seminars with the coordinators. During the semester, interns become aware of the range of career options within an organization and also gain a realistic picture of the working world.

This edition of Executive Internship News highlights second semester and summer students. The newsletter gives the reader the opportunity to become familiar with a variety of experiences available to academically motivated high school seniors. Sponsoring businesses or agencies have been highlighted so you may see the partnerships that have evolved as a result of the Executive Internship Program.

THE EXECUTIVE INTERNSHIP PROGRAM HISTORY

The Executive Internship Program began in Pinellas County in 1974. Since its origin many changes have occurred; a name change, formerly called Community Leadership, an association with a national network of similar secondary programs has been established, the numbers of students has increased, and the scope of the program has greatly expanded. Over 2,000 students have participated. Below is a sampling of their comments regarding their Executive Internship experience.

UNDER the guidance of Marge Schabel, O.T.R., GOTFRIED MELINDA experienced all kinds of occupational therapy at Bayfront Medical Center. Shadowing Sue Scheider and Karen Kearney, Melinda got to visit a number of patients on the regular hospital Her primary floors. experience came from the working on rehabilitation floor. In the rehabilitation clinic, she worked with five therapists. Melinda got to work one-onone with many patients. Melinda's experience has convinced her that a career in occupational therapy is definitely what she wants.

WITH the supervision of John Reiter, Ronald Barnhart, and Mario Ferfoglia, the partners in Edifice Corporation Architects. During her internship with Officer Brooks, he allowed her to assist him with his classroom presentations, his daily duties, and taught her the mental and physical aspects of being an SRO. Officer Brooks also allowed her to be "in charge" of his office when he was not able to be there. She answered guestions for students, filled out numerous theft reports, and kept the office in order. He treated her more like a partner than his assistant (intern), even the school administrators looked at her from a different viewpoint. Michelle said the Executive Intern Program gave her more confidence, and helped her decide on a career in law enforcement. She strongly recommends the program to any high school student who has not yet decided on a career.

She observed many different treatments and suraical procedures and was able to learn some medical terminology and a few surgical techniques, such as how to tie sutures. Office manager and surgical assistant Carol Nucci helped Kacy understand how a podi**a**tric office is run smoothly and efficiently. She helped out around the office by giving Carol a hand setting up for surgery and doing typical office work, like typing patient reports. Through her experience as an Intern, Kacy has learned how much a career in medicine really means to her, and has decided to continue her pre-medical education.

WHILE interning at Eckerd Photolab Express under Ronald Corn. Jr., SUSAN RODNITE learned the art of photofinishing. quality Ronald Corn, Jr. showed her how much patience, dedication, and intelligence it takes to produce a quality product. She learned the importance of maintenance. worked with a computer to derive Kodak Colorwatch scores, and aided Ronald Corn, Jr. in process control and inventory. Overall she found her internship valuable experience not only in photo finishing, but business management. She has decided to continue her education in business management.
