- © Counts for monthly parent meeting credit.












IF my student needs help...

- If your child is struggling or has a problem in class:
 - © Contact the teacher first
 - Ask teacher for tutoring schedule (if available)
 - Check Portal and Canvas regularly (minimum weekly)

- Allow students to be more proactive:
 - Let them email
 - Pick up paperwork
 - Make appointment with counselor

Parents/Families, you can help with.

- Attend monthly meetings as well as parent/teacher conferences when requested.
- © Check grades regularly
- © Chat with your student about how classes are going and sign homework
- Pelp your student to follow Fundamental Policies and Procedures/Dress Code



- Earning 6 demerits in one grading period (notice of violation to be signed by parent)
- Additional 6 demerits in one grading period (12 total) will require parent/student to attend the Intervention Appeals Committee (IAC)
- Discipline Referrals:
 - No more than 1 in any 9-week period
- **Detentions:**
 - No missed detention
 - No more than 10 in the school year









PCS Connects

- ALL students will have a one-to-one device
- Students are responsible for:
 - Charging laptops nightly
 - ∇ Keep your laptop away from any food or drink
 - ☑ Use your laptop for academic purposes ONLY
 - PHOID YOUR LAPTOP WITH BOTH HANDS WHEN YOU NEED TO MOVE IT
 - \bigcirc Safely store it at the end of the day

- Share your username and password
- Download any programs
- Allow others to use your laptop

- Send inappropriate message to others
- Access inappropriate images or websites
- Leave your laptop on the floor or in a hot car

Dress Code



Students are to follow the dress code found in the Student Code of Conduct, in addition to the Fundamental Dress Code Policy

Fundamental Dress Code Policy:

- Presses and skirts should be NO shorter than mid-thigh
- NO shorts
- Shoes MUST have a heel strap (this includes Croc they are to be worn with strap)

Dress Code Violations



Students will be sent to their alpha clerk to call home and request a change of clothing (they will remain in IC until a change of clothes can be brought)

Students will be issued a detention for violation of dress code.

Repeated dress code violations my result in, but are not limited to, a referral and/or and IAC appointment.



Unacceptable Attire

- Shorts of any kind
- Clothing that bares the midriff or shoulders
- Jeans with rips/shreds/tears
- Flip flops/slides (shoes without straps

- See through shirts/clothing
- P Halter tops
- © Clothing that is disruptive to the learning environment
- © Clothing and/or jewelry depicting inappropriate symbols, signs, etc.

Athletics


ALL student athletes MUST have paperwork turned in and fully processed BEFORE they are able to participate in ANY sport.
