The Pinellas County School District, in accordance with FL Statute 381.0056(4)(a), provides health screenings for students enrolled in public school. These screenings include vision, hearing, scoliosis (grade six only), and Body Mass Index, along with any appropriate follow-up. If you do not want your child to participate in any of these screenings, you must notify your child's school in writing. For questions regarding physical exams, immunization requirements, or screenings, please contact School Health Services at (727) 588-6320.
