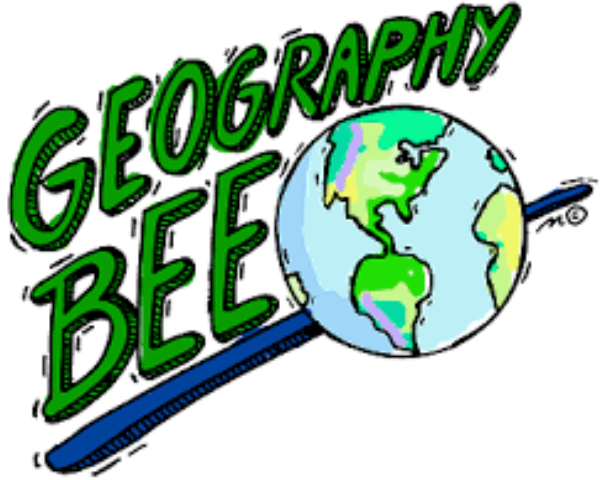

## STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

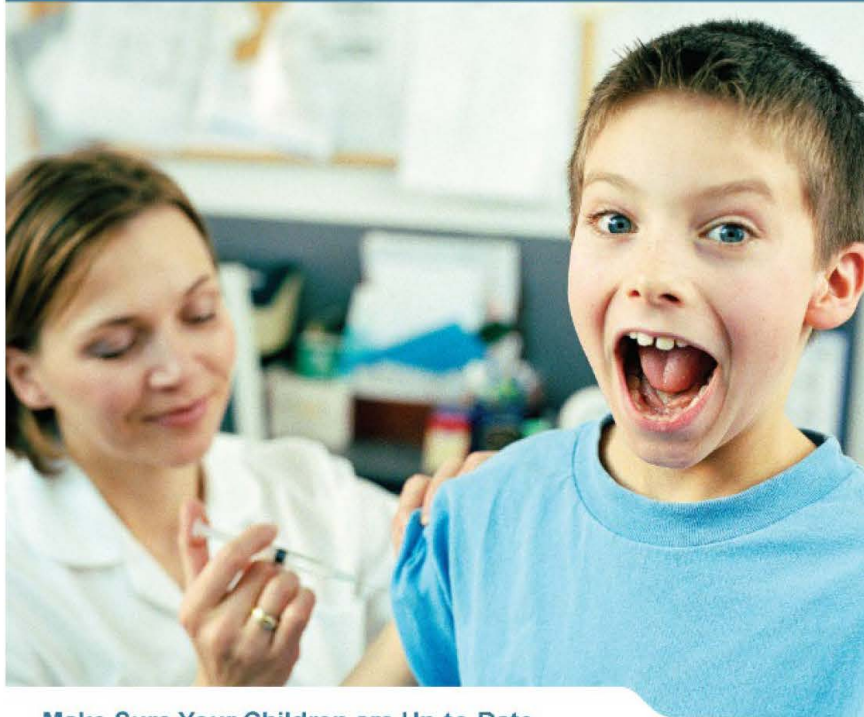

## Be Ready for 7th Grade



### Make Sure Your Children are Up-to-Date

Hello Parents of 6<sup>th</sup> graders. Did you know that all students entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade are required to receive the Tdap (Tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis) vaccine? This must be documented on an updated *Florida Certification of Immunization* (DH 680 form) and submitted to the school prior to the start of 7<sup>th</sup> grade. Most students can receive this vaccine now while in 6<sup>th</sup> grade, so please reach out to your Pediatrician or stop by your local Department of Health (no appointment necessary) to ensure there is no delay in entering class on the first day of the 19/20 school year. Protection from some early childhood vaccines can wear off. Review your child's immunization records with a health care provider to make sure all vaccines recommended for adolescents are up-to-date. Florida immunization requirements are found in the *Immunization Guidelines for Florida Schools, Childcare Facilities, and Family Daycare Homes*, which is incorporated by reference in Rule 64D-3.046, *Florida Administrative Code*.

**The Mentoring Effect** – One in three young children are growing up without a mentor. With a mentor at-risk students are:

- 52% less likely than their peers to skip a day of school
- 55% more likely to be enrolled in college
- 46% less likely than their peers to start using drugs
- 81% more likely to report participating regularly in sports or extracurricular activities
- 78% more likely to volunteer regularly in their communities
- 130% more than twice as likely to say that they held a leadership position in a club or sports team
- 90% respondents who had a mentor said they are now interested in becoming a mentor

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that your student will take the Grade 8 Statewide Science Assessment on May 9th. The Statewide Science Assessment measures Grade 8 student achievement of the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards in Science.

The Grade 8 Statewide Science Assessment consists of two 80-minute paper-based test sessions administered in one day. If you or your student would like to gain familiarity with the item types and response formats your student will see on his or her Statewide Science Assessment, sample questions and answer keys are available at <http://www.fldoe.org/accountability/assessments/k-12-student-assessment/science.stml>.

Please review the following policies with your student before testing:

- **Electronic Devices**—Students are not permitted to have any electronic devices, including, but not limited to, cell phones, smartphones, and smartwatches, at any time during testing or during breaks (e.g., restroom), **even if the devices are turned off or students do not use them**. If your student is found with an electronic device, his or her test will be invalidated.
- **Calculators**—Four-function calculators will be provided to students for Grade 8 Science at the time of testing. **No other calculators may be used**. For the Grade 5 Science assessment, calculators may **not** be used.
- **Testing Rules Acknowledgment**—All Statewide Science Assessments include a Testing Rules Acknowledgment that reads: “I understand the testing rules that were just read to me. The purpose of this letter is to inform you that your student will take the computer-based Civics End-of-Course Assessment on May 9th. Each NGSSS EOC assessment is administered in one 160-minute session, but students may work up to the length of a typical school day.

Your student will have had an opportunity to participate in a practice test to become familiar with the software, item types, and online tools he or she will encounter and use during testing. If you or your student would like to review the computer-based practice test at home, you can access a practice test at PearsonAccess Next (<https://fl.pearsonaccessnext.com>). Your student may practice as often as necessary prior to testing.

Please review the following policies with your student before testing:

- **Electronic Devices**—Students are not permitted to have any electronic devices, including, but not limited to, cell phones, smartphones, and smartwatches, at any time during testing or during breaks (e.g., restroom), **even if the devices are turned off or students do not use them**. If your student is found with an electronic device, his or her test will be invalidated.
- **Calculators**—For Biology 1 EOC assessments, students may use the built-in calculator, or they may use a handheld four-function calculator. **No other calculators may be used.**
- **Testing Rules Acknowledgment**—All NGSSS tests include a Testing Rules Acknowledgment that reads: “I understand the testing rules that were just read to me. If I do not follow these rules, my test score may be invalidated.” Prior to testing, test administrators read the rules to students, and students acknowledge that they understand the testing rules by clicking a radio button next to the statement.
- **Discussing Test Content after Testing**—The last portion of the testing rules read to students before they acknowledge the Testing Rules Acknowledgment reads: “Because the content of all statewide assessments is secure, you may not discuss or reveal details about the test content (including test items and passages) after the test.
