Dear Families,

It was great to see so many of you at our Fall Festival. Thank you to our committee for putting together such a wonderful event and our volunteers who supported with their time, talent, as well as our families who supported with the wonderful donations of candy! I love being part for the Seminole Elementary family! We have fun at Seminole Elementary, but we also work hard.

Your child is hard at work learning grade level standards in all subject areas and our teachers are working hard to ensure positive learning experiences aimed at supporting your child's strengths and areas for growth. Please mark your calendar for the Progress Monitoring 2 testing window of December 5 - 22. Your child's teacher will communicate the specific days in which your child is testing as we get closer to the testing window. This Progress monitoring cycle is very important as it will measure your child's acquisition of grade level standards and we will use this information to compare their mastery of the standards from where they were at the beginning of the year during Progress Monitoring 1 (before being taught the content) to now, after being taught some of the content. The expectation is that we will see growth in students' mastery of grade level standards. Students in grades VPK-2 will receive paper copies of the reports after testing is completed and students in grades 3-5 will have their reports sent to their Focus accounts. Reading Expectations



Students are expected to read Monday - Thursday and parents should sign reading logs

- 30 minutes minimum for grades K-2
- 45 minutes minimum for grades 3-5



Spooky Season is upon us, and the Art Room is bubbling with exciting artwork! Kindergarteners have been learning about shapes, and have created Monster Shape collages

- 1st graders have been studying the lines found in spiderwebs, as well as the lines and shapes in a spider for their spiderweb collages.
- 2nd graders are witchy outfit designers, using collaged patterned leggings and uniquely curly toed shoes.
- 3rd graders are using visual texture to add a variety of texture to their owls.
- 4th graders are beginning to watercolor paint with masking tape masks.
- 5th graders are using visual texture to create one of a kind dragon eyes with watercolor pencils.



Bullying, Teasing, Conflicts, Oh My



What is bullying? Bullying means someone is being hurt on purpose more than once over a period of time. They are being attacked physically, socially, and/or emotionally. There is an unequal balance of power between the bully and the victim.

What is teasing? Teasing means to make fun of someone in a playful way. It is meant for everyone to have fun, no one is getting physically hurt, however someone may be emotionally hurt.

What is a mean moment? A mean moment, like bullying, means that someone is being hurt on purpose and there is a reaction to a strong feeling or emotion. The difference is, it is an isolated event and does not happen all the time.

What is a conflict? A conflict means that no one is having fun, but there is an equal balance of power. This is a disagreement that has a possible solution that those involved can come up with once everyone is feeling calm. Sometimes it helps to have mediator to help reach a solution everyone is comfortable with.
