Dinner Dilemmas

March's Word of the Month is Self-Control - Managing your emotions, and choosing acceptable behaviors Purpose: To create family discussions that promotes Character Education in Pinellas County.

Dinner Dilemmas are designed to go home once a month with the students for family discussion.

Week 1

Situation: Sam and his brother are home alone. His parents have a strict rule about no snacks before dinner. Dilemma: On the one hand Sam can give into his temptation and raid the cookie jar. On the other hand, Sam knows he should show self-control and wait until after dinner. Discussion: What advice do you have for Sam?

Week 2

Situation: Sam is playing ball with his friend. The ball accidentally hits Sam hard. It hurts, begins to swell, and is turning red.

Dilemma: On one hand Sam is very angry and wants to throw the ball back at him to show his friend it hurts. On the other hand, Sam knows he should show self-control and calm down. Discussion: What advice do you have for Sam?

Week 3

Situation: Sue's best friend becomes friends with a new student. Sue is jealous and worries about losing her best friend. Dilemma: On the one hand Sue wants to tell her friend not to sit with the new student at lunch. On the other hand, Sue knows she should show self-control and talk about her feelings. Discussion: What is your advice for Sue?

Week 4

Situation: The students in Sue's class are loud and noisy. The teacher is trying to get their attention.

Dilemma: On one hand Sue wants to finish her conservation with her friends. On the other hand, Sue knows to show selfcontrol she needs to stop talking. Discussion: What is your advice for Sue?


