Week 4 Situation: The students in Sue's class are loud and noisy. The teacher is trying to get their attention. Dilemma: On one hand Sue wants to finish her conservation with her friends. On the other hand, Sue knows to show self-control

Staying Safe and Healthy



Flu season is in full swing! District-wide, there have been reports of increased student absenteeism due to influenza or influenza-like illness. Flu season lasts through April, although activity typically peaks in February. There are a number of ways you can promote staff and student wellbeing through this germy time of year:

- 1. Promote good hand washing with staff and students. Regular hand washing is one of the best and most effective ways to remove germs, avoid becoming ill, and prevent the spread of illness to others around you. If soap and water are not available, alcoholbased hand sanitizers are an alternative until soap and water become available.
- 2. Clean and disinfect high-touch surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with germs. In a school setting, these would include doorknobs, toys, manipulatives, sinks, tables, desks and chairs.
- 3. Teach students to avoid touching their eyes, nose or mouth. These are the easiest routes for germs to enter the body.
- 4. Teach students to cover their nose and mouth with a tissue or their sleeve. This helps prevent the germs from becoming airborne and getting breathed in by others.
- 5. Encourage staff and students to stay home when they are sick. School Health Services continues to monitor absenteeism rates in schools and communicate with the Department of Health in Pinellas regarding any concerning trends. There are guidelines in place for exclusion from work or school when staff or students are ill. School nurses are always available to go into classrooms and teach students the importance of healthy habits during this time of year!

Counselor's Corner

We have been focusing on Honesty this month as our character word. There are many ways we can teach our children to be honest. The best is by example. It's important for them to see you being honest. Also, we can use situations that come up as times for discussions about trustworthiness (e.g. "I know I can trust you when you are honest with me"). You may want to ask your child "Why do you think it's important to be honest?", "How do you feel when you know someone is being honest with you?", "How do you feel when they are not being honest?", or "Why is it hard to be honest sometimes?" We do need to remember when we are honest, though, to be careful of what we say. Children, and adults too, often say what's on their mind without thinking about or realizing how it might affect others. It can be difficult to "filter" sometimes, but it is important to help our children learn how to stop and think before they say something.
