Dear Seminole Families,

All of our students have completed their MAP (Measure of Academic Progress) Assessments. These assessments are given three times each year and is helpful for monitoring student academic progress and learning gains. Information from the MAP Assessments helps us identify students that would benefit from our before and after school tutor programs. We are excited to let you know that we already started with our after-school Rise Reading Tutor Program for students in grades 2 and 3. More information will be coming out within the next few weeks as we expand the before and after school tutoring programs to other grade levels. Next week we will be starting our before school STEM enrichment program for students in grades 2-4. We still have a few seats left. Contact the office for registration information. 727-547-7668.

This school year brought about some changes and new programs. One new change that has been very popular with the students has been our lunch time recess. Students have the opportunity to go outside each day on the playground following their lunch period. We are currently looking for volunteers to help escort classes to the playground area and help supervise children as they play. Teachers plan daily circles and Seminole students respond by sharing and generating their thoughts. The morning circle topics that come up can inform any larger scale insights a classroom teacher might want to implement. Teachers are using circles so that students can have this experience regularly. We feel that students starting the day with a sense of belonging is a necessary precondition for our Seminole students to thrive. Teachers intentionally create opportunities where students learn about each other, talk to each other, and support each other. We feel that daily circles are a way to heighten our Seminole Pride.
