### St. Pete High Art Teacher inspires students to embrace their differences

What started as a means to encourage her students to enter an art competition transitioned into the art teacher herself being on a billboard-sized display.

St. Petersburg High School Visual Arts Teacher Rachel Koral first learned of the 'Embracing Our Differences' annual outdoor exhibit last fall and immediately thought of her students. The exhibit, which started in 2004, uses the power of art and prose to promote inclusion, kindness and respect and is displayed in Sarasota's Bayfront Park as well as St. Petersburg's Poynter Park.

"I told them, if you do it, I will do it also," Koral said of entering the competition. "In the end, it became something much bigger. It proved that anything is possible and that there are opportunities outside the classroom as an artist."

Aadith Moorthy has never shied away from solving big problems.

As his Palm Harbor University High School chemistry teacher Bob Dull can attest, Moorthy not only challenged his teachers to develop more complex concepts, but he also solved them in unconventional ways.

That same problem-solving ability has matriculated into Moorthy's life work, except instead of chemistry equations, Moorthy is now

addressing climate change on a global scale.

Moorthy was awarded The Earthshot Prize on November 7, 2023, in Singapore. The award is championed by Founder and President Britain's Prince William and is often compared to the Nobel Prize or the Oscars of environmental action.

"Winning The Earthshot Prize has definitely helped us accelerate, because it's a growing brand out there in the sustainability world," Moorthy said from his office in San Mateo, California. "And having the recognition enables us to ultimately work with more clients, work with more partners, work with more farmers and just accelerate our scaling."

Gibbs High School's boys' basketball coach Larry Murphy has been named the *2024 Florida Dairy Farmers Boys Basketball Coach of the Year* on Wednesday.

Murphy led Gibbs to a 27-5 record and the Class 4A state championship this season, the program's first state title since 1969.

## 22-year bus driver receives keys to Habitat home

After months of construction and \$200,000 worth of contributions by 65 Tampa Bay area CEOs, Tangela Butler, who has driven a bus for Pinellas County Schools for 22 years, is now a homeowner.

Habitat for Humanity provided Butler and her four children, two who are St. Petersburg High School students, with keys to their new home on Friday, March 29.

"We're moving in tonight!" Butler said from in front of her new home, surrounded by family, friends and school district employees, including more than 25 fellow bus drivers. "If you have a dream of home ownership, never give up."

Butler said her frustrations and feelings of defeat crept in regularly as she searched for many months for an affordable home in St. Petersburg. When she was accepted to Habitat for Humanity, she "cried and cried."
